ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE, providing for the condemnation, appropriation, taking and damaging of Lots One (1) to Four (4), inclusive, and the East Sixty (60) feet of Lots Five (5) to Thirteen (13), inclusive, in Block Seventy-four (74), in the plat of the Lake Union Shore Lands, all in the City of Seattle, for garbage crematory and destructor and other municipal purposes, and providing that the payment for said property and property rights be made from the proceeds of the sale of negotiable bonds of the City of Seattle, approved by the electors of the City of Seattle at a special election held September 5th, 1911.

WHEREAS, Public necessity and convenience demand that Lots One (1) to Four (4) inclusive, and the East Sixty (60) feet of Lots Five (5) to Thirteen (13) inclusive, in Block Seventy-four (74) in the plat of the Lake Union Shore Lands, all in the City of Seattle, be condemned, appropriated, taken and damaged for garbage crematory and destructor and other municipal purposes; and,

WHEREAS, the condemnation and use of said property for garbage crematory and destructor and other municipal purposes will be a general benefit to the City of Seattle;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That Lots One (1) to Four (4) inclusive, and the East Sixty (60) feet of Lots Five (5) to Thirteen (13) inclusive, in Block Seventy-four (74) in the plat of the Lake Union Shore Lands, all in the City of Seattle, together with all rights, privileges and other property lying within said lots or portions of lots, be and the same are hereby condemned, appropriated, taken and damaged for garbage crematory and destructor and other municipal purposes.

Section 2: That the payment for the property and property rights described herein be made from the proceeds of the sale of negotiable bonds of the City of Seattle, approved by the electors of said City at a special election held September 5th, 1911.

Section 3: That the Corporation Counsel be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to begin and prosecute the actions and proceedings in the manner provided by law to condemn, take, damage and appropriate the lands and other property necessary to carry the provisions of this ordinance.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 4 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
