ORDINANCE NO. 31789

AN ORDINANCE vacating a portion of Blanchard Street on the petition of the Port of Seattle.

Whereas, there has been filed with the City Council the petition of the Port of Seattle (File No. 52641) asking for the vacation of that portion of Blanchard Street between the westerly margin of Railroad Avenue and the outer harbor line; and

Whereas, at the hearing on said petition on the 25th day of August, 1913, the same was duly granted by the City Council;

Now Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Blanchard Street, in the City of Seattle, between the westerly margin of Railroad Avenue and the outer harbor line, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Ordinance 31789 (To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
