ORDINANCE NO. 10784

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor of the City of Seattle to incur additional expenditures during the months of November and December, 1916 in secret service work in connection with the enforcement of the laws relating to the keeping and sale of intoxicating liquors in the City of Seattle, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Mayor of the City of Seattle is authorized to incur additional expenditures, not exceeding the sum of \$1,800.00, for the months of November and December, 1916, in secret service work in connection with the enforcement of the laws and ordinances relating to the keeping and sale of intoxicating liquors in the City of Seattle, which sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the general fund for such purpose.

Section 2. The City Comptroller is authorized and directed to draw a warrant on the general fund in the sum of \$1,800.00 in favor of the Mayor of the City of Seattle, for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of Section 1 hereof.

Section 3. Whereas, no provision has been made in the 1916 tax levy for the appropriation herein authorized; therefore, an item shall be included in the next general tax levy to pay the deficiency in the general fund hereby created.

Section 4. Whereas, it is necessary that the money herein appropriated be available as soon as possible; therefore, this ordinance shall take effect without delay.

Section 4. By reason of the facts set forth in this ordinance an emergency is declared to exist; therefore this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
