ORDINANCE NO. 49263

AN ORDINANCE amending Section 2 of Ordinance No. 36,242, entitled "An Ordinance relating to the manufacture, keeping, sale, transportation, use and disposition of intoxicating liquor within the City of Seattle, providing penalties for violations of the provisions hereof, repealing Ordinance No. 35,503 relating to intoxicating liquor, approved December 1, 1915, and all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith", approved August 8, 1916, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 2 of Ordinance No. 36,242, entitled "An Ordinance relating to the manufacture, keeping, sale, transportation, use and disposition of intoxicating liquor within the City of Seattle, providing penalties for violations of the provisions hereof, repealing Ordinance No. 35,503 relating to intoxicating liquor, approved December 1, 1915, and all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith," approved August 8, 1916, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. The phrase "intoxicating liquor" wherever used in this ordinance shall be held and construed to include alcohol, whiskey, brandy, gin, rum, wine, ale, beer, jamaica ginger (meaning any liquid or solution in which jamaica ginger is combined or mixed with alcohol in any quantity whatever), and any spiritous, vinous, fermented or malt liquor, and every other liquor or liquid containing intoxicating properties which is capable of being used as a beverage, whether medicated or not, and all liquids whether proprietary, patented or not, which contain any alcohol, which are capable of being used as a beverage, and any tablets, powder, pellets, liquid or other substance from which any of the foregoing, or a misleading imitation thereof, may be manufactured or concocted by mixing the same with water or other liquids.

Section 2. Whereas, it is the purpose of this amendment to bring jamaica ginger within the provisions of said Ordinance No. 36,242, and it is in the interest of the public peace, health and safety that the manufacture, keeping, sale, transportation, use and disposition of jamaica ginger should be regulated under authority of said ordinance at the earliest possible date; therefore,

Section 3. By reason of the facts set forth in this ordinance an emergency is declared to exist; therefor this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
