

Ordinance No 34618

To prohibit the suspension of signs and transparencies over  
the sidewalks.

The City of Seattle does ordain as follows:

Section 1.

That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation to suspend or cause to be suspended any sign or transparency over any sidewalk within the City of Seattle.

Section 2.

That each sign and transparency must be securely fastened to the building and placed at a height of not less than nine feet above the surface of the sidewalk, and must not project more than three feet from such building.

Section 3.

That all lamps hereafter erected to be used as signs and advertisements shall conform in size to the street lamps now in use.

Section 4.

That all signs and transparencies heretofore erected or suspended and now in place which do not conform to the provisions of this Ordinance shall be forthwith removed; and every person, firm or corporation who shall hereafter maintain, suffer or allow any sign or transparency to remain in front of, suspended to, or attached to the premises owned or controlled by such person, firm or corporation which does not conform to the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof, shall be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars.

Section 5.

That every person, firm or corporation guilty of violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, on conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding fifty dollars.

Section 6.

That it shall be the duty of the Chief of Police to enforce the provisions of this Ordinance, and to remove all signs and transparencies which do not conform to the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 7.

That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force at and from

after the expiration of five days after the same shall have been published.

### Ordinance No. 419

To provide for lighting the Streets of the City of Seattle, and fixing the limits within which property shall be subject to a Special tax for Gas light.

The City of Seattle does ordain as follows:

#### Section 1.

That the following shall be the limits within which property shall be subject to a special tax for lighting the streets with gas, and within which the City shall furnish gas lights to wit: Commencing at the south east corner of Pine and West streets, and running thence southerly along the east line of West Street to the shore of Elliotts Bay, thence continuing southerly on a line parallel with Front Street and two hundred and fifty six feet west of the west line of Front Street, to the north line of Mill Street, thence south to the north west corner of Block 1 of David S. Maynard's plat of Seattle, thence south on a line parallel with Commercial Street and 256 feet west of the west line of Commercial Street to the south west corner of Block 4 of said Maynard's plat, thence east to the north west corner of King and Eighth Streets, thence north along the west line of Eighth Street to the south side of Mill Street, thence easterly to the north west corner of Mill and north Eighth Streets, thence northerly on the west line of Eighth Street to the south side of Pine Street, thence westerly along the south side of Pine Street
