ORDINANCE NO. 42.

RELATIVE TO INDIAN WOMEN.

Approved Aug. 11, 1873.

The City of Seattle does ordain as follows :

SECTION 1.—That all dissolute Indian women or other disreputable persons found loitering or strolling about on any street, wharf, alley or common or any public or private place within the city, except actually leaving the city by steamer or other conveyance, or arriving by such conveyance, shall, if found after 9 p. m. during the months of May, June, July, August and September, and after 8 p. m. of October, November, December, January, February, March and April of each year, be deemed vagrants and punished as such in accordance with Ordinance No. 32 of the Ordinances of the City of Seattle.

Sec. 2.—This Ordinance to be in effect from and after its passage.
