ORDINANCE NO. 45452

AN ORDINANCE relating to, and regulating the business of peddling and hawking, prohibiting peddling and hawking in certain areas, and amending Section 8 of Ordinance No. 34821.

Be it Ordained by The City of Seattle as follows:

Section 1. That Section 8 of Ordinance No. 34821, entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE licensing and regulating the business of peddling and hawking and the conduct of persons engaged therein in the City of Seattle, providing penalties for violation thereof, and repealing Sections 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54 and 55 of Ordinance No. 15855, entitled, 'An Ordinance to license and regulate certain trades and occupations in the City of Seattle and providing penalties for the violation thereof,' approved April 25, 1907,"

and approved June 3, 1915, be amended to read as follows:

Section 8. It shall be unlawful for any person, whether a licensed hawker or peddler, or not, to hawk or peddle any article or thing, except newspapers, magazines, bread, milk or ice, on any street, alley, avenue or other public place in the City of Seattle, within the following boundaries and limits, to-wit:

Beginning at the junction of Denny Way and the waters of Elliott Bay, thence East on Denny Way to First Avenue, thence South on First Avenue to Virginia Street, thence East on Virginia Street to Eighth Avenue, thence South on Eighth Avenue to Union Street, thence West on Union Street to Fifth Avenue, thence South on Fifth Avenue and Fifth Avenue South to Dearborn Street, thence West on Dearborn Street to Elliott Bay, thence North along the shore of Elliott Bay to the place of beginning. The prohibited area shall include both sides of all streets named above.

It shall be unlawful for any person, whether a licensed hawker or peddler, or not, to hawk or peddle any article or thing, except newspapers, magazines, bread, milk or ice, upon the follow-

ing streets:

Pine Street from Eighth Avenue to Broadway,
Pike Street from Eighth Avenue to Fourteenth Avenue, Broad-
way and Broadway North from Union Street to Mercer Street.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
