AN ORDINANCE relating to, and fixing the compensation to be paid to the incumbents of, certain positions and places of employment in the Police and Fire Departments of the City of Seattle, repealing all ordinances and parts thereof in conflict herewith, and providing for the referendum hereof.

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Seattle as follows:

SECTION 1. On and after January 1, 1930, in addition to such other positions and places of employment as may be established by the City Charter or by Ordinance for the year 1930, there shall be, and are hereby created and established, the following positions and places of employment in the Police Department of the City of Seattle, the incumbents of which shall draw and receive monthly compensation for their services therein, as follows:

SECTION 2: On and after January 1, 1930, in addition to such other positions and places of employment as may be established by City Charter or by Ordinance for the year 1930, there shall be, and are hereby created and established, the following positions and places of employment in the Fire Department of the City of Seattle, the incumbents of which shall draw and receive monthly compensation for their services therein as follows:

SECTION 3. Where more than one rate of compensation is provided for any position enumerated in either Section 1 or Section 2 hereof, the incumbent of each of such positions shall receive the minimum rate so specified for and during the year 1930, except the incumbent of each of the positions of Patrolmen, Police Matrons, Police Women, Poundmaster, Firemen, Marine Stoker, Marine Oiler, and Hydrant Inspector, and as to them each shall receive during the year 1930, the second rate of compensation specified, and thereafter during each succeeding year, he shall be advanced to and receive the next higher rate of compensation until he shall have attained to the maximum rate so specified; provided, however, that if any of such positions shall be filled by original appointment during the year 1930, or subsequent thereto, the person so appointed shall receive compensation during his first year of service therein at the minimum rate specified and thereafter he shall be advanced annually to the successive rates of compensation until he shall have attained to the maximum rates specified.

SECTION 4. Those employes of the Fire Department of said city who shall on December 31, 1929, be the incumbents of any positions or places of employment with the grade or rank of Captain or Lieutenant, shall automatically succeed to the positions of Senior Captains and Junior Captains, respectively.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts thereof, in conflict

herewith are hereby repealed; Provided, however, that this repeal shall not in anywise effect the provisions of any ordinance insofar as the same relates to positions or compensation attached thereto for any period of time preceding the first day of January, 1930.

Section 7. The first six (6) sections of this ordinance shall be, and are hereby, referred to the qualified electors (voters) of the city for approval or rejection at the general municipal election to be held in said city on the 12th day of March, 1929, and if the same shall receive in its favor a majority of all the votes cast for and against the same, it shall be in full force and effect from and after the proclamation thereof by the Mayor; and if it shall fail to receive the majority vote in its favor it shall be considered as rejected and shall be of no force or effect.

Section 8. That there be submitted to the qualified electors (voters) of the City of Seattle at the general municipal election to be held in said city on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, 1929, a proposition of the ratification or rejection of the first six (6) sections hereof.

Section 9. That at the general municipal election to be held in the City of Seattle, and in each of the several voting precincts therein on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, 1929, there shall be voted upon by the qualified electors (voters) of said city, the proposition of the ratification or rejection of the first six (6) sections of this ordinance.

Section 10. That the proposition so submitted shall be voted upon in the following manner, to-wit:

There shall be placed upon the ballot a statement of said proposition in substantially the following form:

"Referendum No. 'A'

Shall Ordinance No. 56716, providing for an increase in pay for policemen and firemen be ratified?

Yes.

No."

Every qualified elector (voter) at such election desiring to vote in favor of the ratification of said ordinance shall vote a ballot containing the word "Yes".

Every qualified elector (voter) at such election desiring to vote for the rejection of said ordinance shall vote a ballot containing the word "No".

Not less than forty-five (45) days before the date of such election the City Comptroller and ex-officio City Clerk shall certify to the Election Board constituted by Remington's Compiled Statutes, §5147 (as amended), such proposition in the form of a ballot title conforming to the foregoing statement of the same, and certify therewith a copy of said ordinance in full.

Section 11 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
