ORDINANCE NO. 52925

REPEALED BY ORDINANCE NO. 59625

AN ORDINANCE relating to the personnel of the City Planning Commission, and amending Sections 1, 2 and 4 of Ordinance No. 47820.

Be it Ordained by The City of Seattle as follows:

Section 1. That Sections 1, 2 and 4 of Ordinance No. 47820, entitled:

"An Ordinance relating to and establishing a City Planning Commission and defining its powers and duties,"

approved October 23, 1924, be, and the same are hereby, amended to read as follows:

Section 1. That there be and hereby is created and established a City Planning Commission, to consist of (twenty-four (24)) members, who shall be persons of recognized ability and conversant with such matters as come within the scope of city planning. The membership of the City Planning Commission shall be constituted as follows: One (1) member of the City Council, and one (1) representative designated by each of the following official bodies: Board of Port Commissioners of the Port of Seattle, Board of Directors of Seattle School District No. 1 of King County, State of Washington, Board of Park Commissioners, and the Board of County Commissioners of King County. These representatives shall be elected annually by the members of their respective bodies, and vacancies shall be filled by election in like manner.

The City Engineer, shall be an ex-officio member of the City Planning Commission. The other eighteen (18) members shall be appointed by the Mayor in the following manner: Three (3) members at large; one for one year, one for two years and one for three years, and one annually thereafter for a term of three years. Each organization hereinafter named shall <sup>one or more</sup> ~~three~~ nominate of its members, and the Mayor shall appoint from each organization one of these se

nominated; The Chamber of Commerce, The Building Trades Council, The Seattle Real Estate Association, The Seattle Federation of Women's Clubs, The Central Labor Council, The Building Owners' and Managers' Association, The Consolidated South District Commercial Club, The Central Federated Clubs, The Associated Clubs of the North End, The Municipal League, The Washington State Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, The Seattle Section of the American Society of Civil Engineers, The Women's City Club of Seattle, and interests representing steam railways, and interests representing marine transportation.

In case any such organization or interest fails to so nominate ~~three~~ candidates, then the Mayor shall appoint, as representative thereof, a person possessing known qualifications with respect to the organization or interest which has failed to certify its three candidates.

Section 2. The Commission shall meet and organize annually, in January of each year. The twelve members of said Commission heretofore appointed shall serve during their respective terms of office; the remaining three members shall be appointed for the following terms: The member from the Central Federated Clubs to serve until the annual meeting of said Commission in January, 1930; the member from the Associated Clubs of the North End to serve until the annual meeting of said Commission in January, 1931; and the member from the Consolidated South District Commercial Club to serve until the annual meeting of said Commission in January, 1932. The successor of any member, other than one appointed to fill a vacancy, shall hold office for three years and until his successor has been appointed and has qualified. Any vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the Mayor for the unexpired portion of the term, and said appointee is to be nominated by the same organization and in like manner as his predecessor.

No member of the Commission shall receive any compensation

for his services as such.

Section 4. Thirteen (13) members of the City Planning Commission shall constitute a quorum. The City Planning Commission may make and alter rules governing its own procedure not inconsistent with the laws of the State and the Charter and ordinances of the City of Seattle. Said Commission shall hold at least one regular meeting each month at such time and place as it may designate.

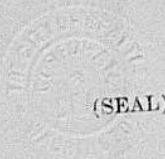
Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
