ORDINANCE NO. 61814

AN ORDINANCE Accepting a deed from Rosemary McDougall and Annie Albinus McDougall to The City of Seattle, and laying off Diagonal Avenue.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the deed from Rosemary McDougall and Annie Albinus McDougall, otherwise known as Mother Cyril of the Carmelite Order of Nuns of Seattle, to The City of Seattle, executed October 10, 1931, to the following described property:

The undivided one-third (1/3) interest in all those portions of Tracts One (1), Two (2), Three (3), Fourteen (14), Fifteen (15), and Sixteen (16), of David Kellogg's Acre Lots according to plat recorded in Volume 4 of Deeds, Page 98, Records of King County, also that portion of Government Lot Four (4), Section Eighteen (18), Township Twenty-four (24) North, Range Four (4) East, W. M., lying northwesterly of a line which is formed by producing southwesterly to the Duwamish Waterway the northerly boundary line of Lot One (1), Block Twenty-three (23), Industrial Addition to the City of Seattle, and lying southeasterly of a line which is one hundred thirty (130.00) feet northwesterly from, measured at right angles thereto, and parallel with the above described northerly boundary line of said Lot One (1), Block Twenty-three (23) of said Industrial Addition to the City of Seattle and the same produced southwesterly to the Duwamish Waterway, containing 2.10 acres, more or less;

for street purposes, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Section 2. In consideration for the deed accepted in Section 1 hereof, the property of the grantors, more particularly described as:

An undivided 1/3 interest in Tracts 1, 2, 3, 4, 14, 15 and 16 of David Kellogg's Acre Lots, excepting the portions of Tracts 4, 14 and 15 condemned and appropriated for Duwamish Waterway No. 1; Also, an undivided 1/3 interest in the south 473.5 feet of the east 810 feet of Government Lot 4, Section 18, Township 24 North, Range 4 East, W.M.

shall be exempted from any assessment to be levied for the acquisition of Diagonal Avenue west of the west line of the Duwamish Waterway.

Section 3. That Diagonal Avenue be and the same is hereby laid off, opened, extended and established over and across the lands described in Section 1 hereof.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
