COUNCIL APPROVES PLAN TO PROCEED WITH ARTERIAL HIGHWAY WORK

City Engineer's Office Submits Detailed Report Showing Status, Cost and Other Data Bearing on Local Projects. 11-15-34

Members of the city council agreed yesterday to proceed with the remaining arterial highway projects provided for under the \$1,128,000 bond issue voted about two years ago. A report was submitted by Major O. A. Piper, assistant city engineer, listing the projects under contract or just completed and the improvements yet to be contracted. The report follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 62995

AN ORDINANCE submitting to the qualified electors (voters) of the City of Seattle at the special municipal election to be held in said City on Tuesday, November 8, 1933, the proposition of creating an indebtedness in the sum of One Million, One Hundred Twenty-eight Thousand and no/100ths (\$1,128,000.00) Dollars and the issuance and sale therefor of general negotiable interest bearing serial coupon bonds of said City, for the purpose of constructing improvements upon the City's arterial highway system; requiring the City Comptroller and Ex-officio City Clerk to certify to the Election Board of King County, Washington, as required by law, the said proposition in the form of a specified ballot title; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there be submitted to the qualified electors (voters) of the City of Seattle, at the special municipal election to be held in said City on Tuesday, the 8th day of November, 1933, for their approval and adoption or rejection, the proposition of creating an indebtedness in the total sum of One Million, One Hundred Twenty-eight Thousand and no/100ths (\$1,128,000.00) Dollars, and the issuance and sale therefor in the manner prescribed by law of general negotiable serial coupon bonds of the City of Seattle in said amount bearing interest at not to exceed six per cent. (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually and maturing annually, in the manner prescribed by Chap. 151, Laws of Washington, 1923, commencing with the second and ending with the thirtieth year after the date of issue, for the purpose of providing funds to pay the cost of constructing unified comprehensive improvements upon the City's arterial highway system, as follows:

Empire Way, from south city limits to Rainier Avenue, paving;

Myers Way and 1st Avenue South, from south city limits to Duwamish Bridge, paving;

Seneca Street, from 7th Avenue to Broadway, widening pavement;

East John Street and East Thomas Street, from Broadway
to 19th Avenue North, widening pavement;

Broad Street, from Aurora Avenue to 5th Avenue North,
center paving;

10th Avenue Northeast, from Bothell Way to East 85th
Street; widening pavement;

Admiral Way, from 47th Avenue Southwest to 63d Avenue
Southwest, paving;

Sylvan Way, from 21st Avenue Southwest to 35th Avenue
Southwest, Grading;

Lakeview Boulevard, from East Prospect Street to East
Blaine Street, grading and paving;

Empire Way (north end), from Montlake Boulevard to
East 55th Street, grading and paving;

Cutting off and widening corners along arterial high-
ways;

Delmar Drive, from 11th Avenue North to Boyer Avenue,
grading and paving;

15th Avenue Northeast, from East 68th Street to East
80th Street, paving tracks;

54th Avenue South, from Rainier Avenue to Hamlet Avenue,
grading;

Jackson Street, from Rainier Avenue to 31st Avenue
South, widening roadway;

Market Street and Seaview Avenue, from 24th Avenue
Northwest to West 60th Street, paving;

West 65th Street, from 3d Avenue Northwest to 32d Ave-
nue Northwest, widening pavement;

East Pacific Street, from University Way to Montlake
Boulevard, widening pavement;

15th Avenue Northeast and East Pacific Street Track
Crossing, grading and paving;

Rainier Avenue, from 57th Avenue South to south city
limits, grading and paving;

8th Avenue South, from East Marginal Way to Duwamish
River, paving;

East Madison Street, from 29th Avenue North to 31st Ave-
nue North, paving;

Beacon Avenue Extension, from 14th Avenue South to 10th
Avenue South and Atlantic Street;

Woodlawn Avenue and 1st Avenue Northeast, from Maple
Leaf Place to East 85th Street, widening roadway
and paving;

Boston Street at 3d Avenue North, paving;

Hillside Place Extension, from 4th Avenue North and Ray Street to 1st Avenue North and Queen Anne Boulevard;

32d Avenue Northwest, from West 59th Street to West 64th Street, and West 59th Street, from 24th Avenue Northwest to 32d Avenue Northwest, center paving;

24th Avenue Northwest, from West 65th Street to West 73d Street, widening paving.

The life of said improvement to be made by the issue of said bonds is hereby declared, in the judgment of the City Council, to be at least thirty (30) years.

The total amount of indebtedness incurred hereunder shall be a part of that indebtedness which, with the assent of the voters, may be incurred for general municipal purposes under the Constitution, in excess of one and one-half per cent. ($1\frac{1}{2}\%$) and up to five per cent. (5%) on the value of the taxable property within the City.

Section 2. That at the special municipal election to be held in the City of Seattle, and in each of the several voting precincts therein, on Tuesday, the 3th day of November, 1932, there shall be voted upon by the qualified electors (voters) of said City, the proposition mentioned in Section 1 of this ordinance; provided, that any other proposition or propositions may be submitted for the incurring of any indebtedness by the City at the same election, in pursuance of any other ordinance or ordinances of said City that may so provide. Said election shall be held and conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the City and the laws of the State of Washington.

Section 3. That the proposition so submitted shall be voted upon in the following manner, to-wit:

"PROPOSITION NO. _____

Shall Seattle issue \$1,123,000.00 in bonds to construct unified comprehensive improvements upon the City's arterial highway system, as contemplated by Ordinance No. _____?

Yes _____ No _____."

Every qualified elector (voter) at such election desiring to vote in favor of the approval and adoption of said proposition shall vote a ballot containing the word "Yes".

Every qualified elector (voter) at such election desiring to vote for the rejection of said proposition shall vote a ballot containing the word "No".

Not less than forty-five (45) days before the date of such election, the City Comptroller and Ex-officio City Clerk shall certify to the Election Board constituted by Rem. Comp. Stat., Sec. 5147 (as amended), said proposition in the form of a ballot title conforming to the foregoing statement of the same.

Section 4. That if three-fifths of the qualified electors (voters) voting on said proposition shall vote in favor of incurring such indebtedness and the issuance and sale of bonds therefor, and the total vote cast upon such proposition shall exceed fifty per cent. (50%) of the total number of voters voting in Seattle at the general county or state election next preceding November 8, 1932, and the City Council shall have, by ordinance, confirmed said loan, then the Mayor and City Comptroller shall be, and they are hereby, authorized to issue and sell said bonds in the total sum authorized and herein specified therefor, in the name and under the corporate seal of the City of Seattle.

Section 5. That the money derived from the sale of

said bonds shall be applied and used solely for the purpose specified in Section 1 hereof, and for no other purpose whatsoever.

Section 6. WHEREAS, the Election Board, pursuant to the request made upon it by the City Council of the City of Seattle by Resolution No. _____, has called a special municipal election to be held in said City on Tuesday, the 8th day of November, 1932, for the submission to the electors of said City for their adoption and approval or rejection of said hereinabove mentioned proposition; and,

WHEREAS, it is mandatory under existing law that the same be certified and provision therefor made by Ordinance in less than thirty (30) days, thereby creating a situation constituting an emergency, which is hereby declared to exist, and in which it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety that this ordinance shall become effective without delay; Now, Therefore,

(Emergency)

Section..... Whereas,

Section..... 7. By reason of the facts set forth in this ordinance an emergency is declared to exist; therefore, this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval, if approved by the Mayor; if not so approved it shall take effect and become a law at the time and in the manner provided for non-emergency ordinances under the provisions of the city charter.
