Section 1. That the sum of one hundred and ninety dollars be transferred from the General or City Fund to the Cemetery Fund of said City, and that said sum of one hundred and ninety dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated out of the General or City Fund of said City to be paid into said Cemetery Fund and that a proper warrant in favor of the City Treasurer for said sum of One hundred and ninety Dollars be issued against said General or City Fund.

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval

An Ordinance relating to the bidding in and purchase of real property in sales on execution or foreclosure in actions wherein the City of Seattle is a party.

The City of Seattle does Ordain as follows.

Section 1. Whenever real property shall be offered for sale to satisfy an execution, judgment, or decree of foreclosure, in any action wherein the City of Seattle is a party, in the absence of bidders or purchasers, or if the bid made by any person for such real property be less than the amount of the judgment and costs recovered by the City in such action, then the properly authorized officer of said City may bid in and purchase such real property in the name of the City of Seattle for the use and benefit of said City, for a sum of money not to exceed the amount required to satisfy

such execution, judgment or decree and the costs therein; and the amount so offered shall be applied to the satisfaction of the judgment in such action.

Section 2. That the City Attorney of said City is hereby authorized to bid in and to purchase in the name of the City of Seattle and for its use and benefit, all such real property as may be sold as provided for in Section one (1) of this Ordinance; and to enter satisfaction of such judgments.

Sec. 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Ordinance No 779.

An Ordinance granting to the Pacific Postal Telegraph Cable Company the right to erect poles and to stretch wires thereon.

The City of Seattle does Ordain as follows:

Section I. That there be and hereby is granted unto the Pacific Postal Telegraph Cable Company, a corporation formed and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of New York and to its successors and assigns the right, privilege, and authority to locate, erect, place, maintain and use in the streets and alleys within the City of Seattle telegraph poles with necessary cross-arms, and to fasten wires on said poles and cross-arms and to stretch such wires through said streets and alleys for the
