ORDINANCE NO. 81609

AN ORDINANCE relating to the acquisition by condemnation of land and other property in Block 10, Paramount Park Addition for park purposes and providing for payment from the Cumulative Reserve Fund.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That public necessity and convenience demand that the following described property, to-wit:

Lots 1 and 2, Block 10, Paramount Park Addition together with all rights, privileges and other property pertaining thereto be and the same are hereby condemned, appropriated and taken for a public use, namely, for park purposes.

Section 2. That the cost of such acquisition shall be paid from the Cumulative Reserve Fund.

Section 3. That the Corporation Counsel is hereby authorized and directed to begin and prosecute the actions and proceedings in the manner provided by law necessary to carry out the provisions of this ordinance.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 4 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
