ORDINANCE NO. 82390

AN ORDINANCE providing for the naming, renaming, defining and establishing of certain streets, avenues, ways, places, boulevards, etc., in the City of Seattle.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the following streets, avenues, ways, places, boulevards, etc., be and the same are hereby named, renamed, defined and established as follows:

- l. 3rd AVENUE NORTHEAST, as existing from East 85th Street to East 91st Street, be LATONA AVENUE;
- 2. WEBSTER PLACE, in Pleasant Ridge Division of Green Lake Addition from East 75th Street to East 77th Street, be 17th AVENUE NORTHEAST:
- 3. CORLISS AVENUE, as existing in Wood's South Division of Green Lake Addition, between North 50th Street and Keystone Place, be KEYSTONE PLACE;
- 4. THACKERY PLACE, as platted in Harrison Heights Addition and University Hill Tracts Addition from East 42nd Street to East 50th Street, be THACKERAY PLACE;
- 5. BURNS AVENUE NORTHWEST, from the south line of West 42nd Street to the north line of Fern Place and from the south line of West 43rd Street to the south line of Bright Street, be 9th AVENUE NORTHWEST;
- 6. THE UNNAMED STREET, as condemned by Ordinance No. 15923 across portions of Block 47, Gilman's Addition, Block 13, Ross Second Addition, across the Northern Pacific Railway Company right of way, and over an unplatted portion of Section 13, Township 25 North, Range 3 East, W.M., from West Nickerson Street at 12th Avenue West to West Ewing Street on the northeasterly side of the railroad right of way, be WEST EWING PLACE;
- 7. EYRIE PLACE, as platted in Carleton Park Addition, from Westmont Way to West McGraw Street, be named EYRES PLACE to conform to the spelling of the name of the street to the north between West McGraw Street and Montavista Place, named by Ordinance No. 70040, EYRES PLACE;
- 8. RUFFNER PLACE, extending from 43rd Avenue West to Magnolia Boulevard between Blocks A and B, Magnolia Heights Addition, be RUFFNER STREET.

- 9. 12th AVENUE WEST and WEST ARMOUR STREET, lying respectively east of Lot 3 and south of Lot 2, Block 3, Maple View Park Addition, being remainders of said streets as originally platted in Prosch's Queen Anne Addition, be WEST NEWELL PLACE;
- 10. REX STREET, from Aurora Avenue to Dexter Avenue as existing in Westlake Boulevard Addition, be HOWESTREET;
- 11. DELMAR DRIVE, extended and improved as a street through
 City Park property from the east line of 11th Avenue
 North to the intersection of Federal Avenue and
 Reanoke Street, be DELMAR DRIVE;
- 12. POST STREET, from Yesler Way to Marion Street and from Madison Street to University Street, be POST AVENUE;
- 13. VIEW AVENUE, in Dell Point Addition, from East Alder Street north a distance of 200 feet, be 34th AVENUE;
- 14. WINTHROP STREET, extended east of Rainier Avenue to 30th Avenue South, as a street under Ordinance Nos. 22002 and 22004, and for park purposes under Ordinance Nos. 22526 and 62096, be MOUNT BAKER BOULEVARD;
- MOUNT BAKER CIRCLE, as existing in Mount Baker Park Addition, from Hanford Street to alley east of 30th Avenue South, and the extension westerly of said Mount Baker Circle to 30th Avenue South, by deed accepted by Ordinance No. 29856, be HANFORD STREET:
- 16. RENTON AVENUE, from Empire Way to Walden Street in Byron Addition, be RENTON PLACE;
- 17. The existing park drive or boulevard, commonly known as CHEASTY BOULEVARD, extending northeasterly from a point on Beacon Avenue just north of Alaska Street through Jefferson Park; thence northerly over unplatted property to an intersection with 26th Avenue South at Andover Street; thence north on 26th Avenue South to Winthrop Street, be CHEASTY BOULEVARD;
- 18. The Alley platted in Blocks 7 and 12, Clarement Addition, and including a portion of Tract B, Claremont Home Tracts, as widened under Ordinance No. 49389 for street and alley purposes, being the alley east of Renton Avenue from Dakota Street to Genesee Street, be LEXINGTON PLACE;
- 19. LAKESIDE AVENUE SOUTH from Oregon Street to 52nd Avenue South in Maynard's Lake Washington Addition, be 52nd AVENUE SOUTH;
- 20. 52nd AVENUE SOUTH from Wilson Avenue to Findlay Street, being an old County Road, now platted in Andrew J.

 Johnson Addition, the Lake Washington Home Addition and the plat showing subdivision in B. W. John's and C. H. Hanford's Five Acre Tracts, filed as Exhibit "A" in King County Superior Court Cause No. 76774, be 52nd TERRACE SOUTH:

- 21. HUDSON PLACE, from Ferdinand Street to Hudson Street in Lockmore 2nd Addition and from Hudson Street to Dawson Street in Homesteads of F. W. Lampe, be 2hth PLACE SOUTH:
- 22. SHAFFER STREET, as platted in Corgiat Addition from Caroline Place northeasterly a distance of approximately 400 feet, be WARSAW STREET;
- 23. ITHICA PLACE in Sturtevent's Rainier Beach Lake Park
 Cottage Tracts between Rainier Avenue and Fletcher
 Place, and named by Ordinance No. 21496, be ITHACA PLACE,
 to conform to the proper spelling of the name;
- 24. WEST MORGAN WAY as platted in Melville-Barth Addition, between Blocks 8 and 9, from West Morgan Street south and southeasterly to second angle point located opposite Lot 18, said Block 9, be 11th PLACE SOUTHWEST;
- 25. WEST MORGAN WAY as platted in Melville-Barth Addition, south from West Morgan Street, between Blocks 6 and 7; and continuing southeasterly between Blocks 6 and 8 to the alley between Blocks 6 and 9, be 10th AVENUE SOUTHWEST;
- 26. THE UNNAMED STREET in the plat of Melville-Barth Addition, between Blocks 8 and 9, from the alley at east side of Block 9, to first angle point west of alley, be WEST WARSAW STREET.
- 27. 33rd AVENUE SOUTHWEST from West Hanford Street to West Stevens Street in Wymore Addition, and from West Stevens Street to West Lander Street in Prospect Tracts, be FAUNTLEROY AVENUE.
