AN ORDINANCE relating to the municipal light and power system; providing for the acquisition by condemnation of certain property in Moore's 5 Acre Tracts (Vol. 9 of Plats, page 28) and portions of vacated Francis Avenue adjoining for a site for substations and a connecting corridor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That public necessity and convenience demand that the following described property situate in Moore's 5 Acre Tracts in King County as recorded in Volume 9 of King County Plats at page 28, to-wit:

A portion of Tracts 56, 61, and 64, Moore's 5 Acre Tracts and portion of vacated Francis Avenue described as follows:

Begin at the point of intersection of the N'ly line of Tract 64, Moore's 5 Acre Tracts and the W'ly margin of East Marginal Way, thence S 23°39'51" E 60.16 feet along said margin, thence S 62°01'41" W parallel to the N'ly line of said Tract 64 and said line produced to the E'ly margin of the Duwamish Waterway, thence N 15° W along said E'ly margin to its intersection with the N'ly line of Tract 56 Moore's 5 Acre Tracts, thence N 62°01'41" E along said N'ly line and said line produced to its intersection with the center line of Francis Avenue (vacated), thence S 27°58'19" E along said center line to its intersection with the N'ly line of said Tract 64 produced SW'ly, thence N 62°01'41" E along the N'ly line produced, and the N'ly line of said Tract 64 to the point of beginning.

be acquired by condemnation for public use, to-wit: as a site for substations and a connecting corridor for the municipal light and power system of the City of Seattle.

Section 2. That such acquisition is hereby declared to be a part of the additions and betterments to, and extensions of the existing municipal light and power plant and system of the City of Seattle provided for by Ordinance No. 82835 and the cost of such acquisition shall be paid from the funds provided by said Ordinance No. 82835.

Section 3. That the Corporation Counsel is authorized and directed to prosecute the action and proceedings necessary, in the manner provided by law, to carry out the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.







Begin at the point of intersection of the N 1/2 line of Tract 64, Moore's 5 Acre Tracts and the W 1/2 margin of Francis Avenue, thence S 23° 38' 51" E 60.16 feet along said margin, thence S 22° 01' 11" W parallel to the E 1/2 line of said Tract 64 and said line produced to the E 1/2 margin of the Duwamish Waterway, thence N 15° W along said E 1/2 margin to its intersection with the N 1/2 line of Tract 64, Moore's 5 Acre Tracts, thence N 62° 01' 41" E along said N 1/2 line and said line produced to its intersection with the center line of Francis Avenue (vacated), thence S 22° 48' 19" E along said center line to its intersection with the N 1/2 line of said Tract 64, produced S 1/2 W, thence N 62° 01' 41" along the N 1/2 line produced, and the N 1/2 line of said Tract 64 to the point of beginning.

to be acquired by condemnation for public use, to-wit: as a site for substations and a connecting corridor for the municipal light and power system of the City of Seattle.

Section 2. That such acquisition is hereby declared to be a part of the additions and betterments to, and extensions of the existing municipal light and power plant and system of the City of Seattle provided for by Ordinance No. 21122 and the cost of such acquisition shall be paid from the funds provided by said Ordinance No. 21122.

Section 3. That the Corporation Council is authorized and directed to prosecute the action and proceedings necessary, in the manner provided by law, to carry out the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
