AN ORDINANCE vacating portion of Jesse Avenue, et al., on petition of Property Owners.

WHEREAS there has been filed with the City Council the petition of Property Owners, (City Comptroller's File No. 223216), for the vacation of portion of the streets as therein fully described; and

WHEREAS at the hearing on said petition on the 3rd day of May, 1954, said petition was duly granted by the City Council; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That

JESSE AVENUE from West Ewing Street to the northeasterly line of West Blewett Street;
WEST BLEWETT STREET from a line 50 feet northerly of and concentric with the center line of the Northern Pacific Railway Main Track as now constructed across Blocks 24, 14 and 13, Ross Addition, to the southeasterly line of Jesse Avenue, and from 6th Avenue West to 8th Avenue West; and
BRAWLEY STREET from 8th Avenue West to the southwesterly line of the Lake Washington Ship Canal right of way,

be and the same are hereby vacated, reserving to the City of Seattle the right to reconstruct, maintain and operate the existing overhead utilities until such time as the beneficiaries of said vacation arrange with the owners of said utilities for their removal.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

BRAWLEY STREET from Eighth Avenue West to the southwest-erly line of the Lake Washington Ship Canal right of way,

be and the same are hereby vacated, reserving to the City of Seattle the right to reconstruct, maintain and operate the existing overhead utilities until such time as the beneficiaries of said vacation arrange with the owners of said utilities for their removal.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provision of the city charter.
