AN ORDINANCE providing for the renaming of West 90th Place, Northlake Avenue, East Northlake Avenue and Cushman Place Southwest in the City of Seattle.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the following streets and avenues be, and the same are hereby renamed, defined and established in accordance with the recommendation of the Board of Public Works (File No. 225311) as follows:

West 90th Place as platted in Olympic Manor Div.No. 2 Addition from West 90th Street to 23rd Avenue Northwest, be WEST 89th PLACE;

Northlake Avenue as existing from Aurora Avenue to 1st Avenue Northeast, be NORTHLAKE WAY;

East Northlake Avenue as existing from 1st Avenue Northeast to 15th Avenue Northeast, be EAST NORTHLAKE WAY; and

Cushman Place Southwest as existing from Orleans Street to West Charlestown Street, be ORLEANS STREET.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
