ORDINANCE NO. 84392

AN ORDINANCE relating to the municipal water supply system of the city, and amending Sections 33 and 34 of Ordinance No. 65877, as amended, to increase the rates and charges for water in order to finance needed additions and betterments thereto and extensions thereof, and to pay maintenance, operation, taxes and other charges, and abolishing, by non-inclusion, the sewerage service charge heretofore collected from surplus in the Water Fund.

WHEREAS, a program of necessary additions and betterments to, and extensions of, the municipal water supply system of the city at an estimated cost of \$48,000,000., to be financed out of the additional water revenues herein provided, including provision for maintenance, operation, taxes and other charges, must be begun immediately; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 33 of Ordinance No. 65877, entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE relating to the Municipal Water Supply System of the City of Seattle, regulating the use of water therefrom, providing for the sale of same, fixing the price thereof and providing a method of collecting rates therefor, providing penalties for violation of this ordinance and repealing all ordinances or parts thereof in conflict therewith."

as last amended by Ordinance No. 70097, be, and the same is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 33. All water used for domestic and commercial purposes shall be supplied by meter only.

The rates for metered water supplied within the City of Seattle in one month or fractional part thereof shall be in accordance with the following schedule:

Each 100 cubic feet in excess of the quantities

500 cubic feet or less..... 1.10

Water used exclusively for manufacturing purposes,
laundries, cemeteries, privately and publicly
owned golf courses, and the operation of eleva-
tors, each 100 cubic feet, in excess of the
first 30,000 cubic feet..... .07

Water supplied to School District No. 1, University
of Washington, Port of Seattle, Fort Lawton
Military Reservation, and Sand Point Naval
Station, and to other governmental units, as
directed by the City Council, each 100 cubic
feet in excess of the first 30,000 cubic feet .07

Water supplied to the City Lighting Department and
to the Seattle Transit Commission, each 100
cubic feet in excess of the quantity allowed for
the foregoing minimum charges..... .07

The rates for water used for manufacturing, laundry and cemetery
purposes, for privately owned golf courses, and for the operation
of elevators, shall be granted only upon written application therefor.

Before granting such application the Superintendent shall ascertain to his satisfaction that the provisions of this ordinance are fully complied with.

The rates for water supplied for fire protection purposes exclusively, shall be deemed service charges and shall be, for any one month, or fractional part thereof, as follows:

Size of Service	Service Charge
2 - in.....	\$ 1.25
3 - in.....	1.90
4 - in.....	2.60
6 - in.....	3.60

The service charges hereinabove set forth shall be granted only during such times as there is no appreciable registration by the meter maintained by the City on such fire protection services.

Water used for any other purpose than for extinguishing fires, through a fire protection service, shall be charged at a rate not less than double the common rate provided for in this ordinance.

Section 2. That Section 34 of Ordinance No. 65877, as last amended by Ordinance No. 70097, be, and the same is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 34. The rates for metered water supplied to premises not within the limits of the City of Seattle shall be for one month, or fractional part thereof, in accordance with the following schedule:

700 cubic feet or less.....	\$ 1.75
Each separate building or premises in addition to the first or principal building or premises supplied through the same service connection, 700 cubic feet or less.....	1.75
Each 100 cubic feet in excess of the first 700 cubic feet, except as hereinafter provided.....	.15
Each 100 cubic feet, exceeding 200,000 cubic feet or more used in one month, except as hereinabove provided.....	.12 $\frac{1}{2}$

Each 100 cubic feet in excess of the first 30,000 cubic feet where 80% of the water is used for manufacturing and industrial purposes, golf courses, and cemeteries..... \$.12

Provided, however, that the rate to be charged municipal water districts organized under the laws of the State of Washington, and where such municipal water districts operate, maintain and distribute their water through a master meter furnished by the City, shall be as follows:

700 cubic feet or less..... 1.10

Each separate building or premises in addition to the first or principal building or premises supplied through the same service connection, 700 cubic feet or less..... 1.10

Each 100 cubic feet in excess of the first 700 cubic feet, except as hereinafter provided..... .11

Each 100 cubic feet, exceeding 200,000 cubic feet or more used in one month, except as hereinabove provided .09

Each 100 cubic feet in excess of the first 30,000 cubic feet where 80% of the water is used for manufacturing and industrial purposes, golf courses, and cemeteries .08

Section 3. The increased rates and charges for water provided for by this ordinance shall become operative beginning October 1st, 1955.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

AN ORDINANCE relating to the municipal water supply system of the city, and amending Sections 23 and 24 of Ordinance No. 5577, and changing for water in order to finance needed additions and betterments thereto and extensions thereof, and to pay maintenance, operation, taxes and other charges, and abolishing, by non-inclusion, the sewerage service charge heretofore collected from surplus in the Water Fund.

WHEREAS, a program of necessary additions and betterments to, and extensions of, the municipal water supply system of the city at an estimated cost of \$4,000,000 to be financed out of the additional water revenues herein provided, including provision for maintenance, operation, taxes and other charges, must be begun immediately; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY

Each 100 cubic feet in excess of the quantity allowed for the foregoing minimum charges

Each separate building or premises in addition to the first or principal building or premises supplied through the same service connection, 100 cubic feet or less

Water used exclusively for manufacturing purposes, commercial, scientific, governmental and publically owned water works, and the operation of elevators, each 100 cubic feet in excess of the first 25,000 cubic feet

Water supplied to Federal District No. 1, University of Washington, Port of Seattle, Fort Lawton Military Reservation, and other Federal, State, and local government, and to other government, shall be charged at the rate of \$1.00 per 100 cubic feet in excess of the first 25,000 cubic feet

Water supplied to the City of Seattle, including the City of Seattle, shall be charged at the rate of \$1.00 per 100 cubic feet in excess of the first 25,000 cubic feet

The rates for water used for manufacturing, scientific, governmental and publically owned water works, and the operation of elevators, shall be charged at the rate of \$1.00 per 100 cubic feet in excess of the first 25,000 cubic feet

The rates for water supplied for the purpose of manufacturing, scientific, governmental and publically owned water works, and the operation of elevators, shall be charged at the rate of \$1.00 per 100 cubic feet in excess of the first 25,000 cubic feet

The service charges hereinabove set forth shall be charged only during the month of June in each year, and shall be paid in advance to the City on or before the 15th day of June.

Water used for any other purpose than for manufacturing, scientific, governmental and publically owned water works, and the operation of elevators, shall be charged at a rate not less than the common rate provided for in this ordinance.

Section 2. That Section 24 of Ordinance No. 5577, as last amended by Ordinance No. 5577, be, and the same is hereby further amended to read as follows:

Section 24. The rates for metered water supplied to premises not within the limits of the City of Seattle shall be for the month, or fractional part thereof, in accordance with the following schedule:

Provided, however, that the rate to be charged municipal water districts organized under the laws of the State of Washington and where such municipal water districts operate, maintain and distribute their water through a master meter furnished by the City, shall be as follows:

Each separate building or premises in addition to the first or principal building or premises supplied through the same service connection, 100 cubic feet or less

Each 100 cubic feet in excess of the first 700 cubic feet, except as hereinafter provided

Each 100 cubic feet, exceeding 500,000 cubic feet or more used in one month, except as hereinafter provided

Each 100 cubic feet in excess of the first 25,000 cubic feet where 50% of the water is used for manufacturing and industrial purposes, golf courses, and cemeteries

Section 3. The increase rates and charges for water provided for by this ordinance shall become operative beginning October 1st, 1955.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
