ORDINANCE 92191

AN ORDINANCE establishing the Human Rights Commission of The City of Seattle; prescribing the duties and functions thereof; creating certain positions in the Executive Department in connection therewith and making appropriations from the Emergency Fund and declaring the emergency therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there is hereby established the Human Rights Commission of The City of Seattle composed of twelve (12) members who shall be representative citizens of the City appointed by the Mayor and subject to confirmation by the City Council.

Original appointees to said Commission shall serve terms of: four (4) for three years, four (4) for two years, and four (4) for one year, respectively. Thereafter all appointments shall be for three-year terms; provided, that any vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as original appointments; and provided further, that the Mayor may remove any member without cause assigned.

Members shall serve without compensation from the City or from any trust, donation or legacy to the City for their service as such members; but this shall not preclude any member or any firm or company with which he is connected from receiving compensation from the City under contract or otherwise for services rendered if such services do not conflict with his duties as a Commissioner.

The Commission may adopt such rules of procedure as are necessary to accomplish the duties prescribed in Section 2 hereof. The Mayor shall select the Commission Chairman.

Section 2. The duties of such Commission shall be: To carry out a public education program and solicit the cooperation of individuals and organizations in the City in promoting equality and

understanding among all citizens; To study and investigate problems arising in the City which may result in tensions or discrimination because of race, color, religion or national origin, and which do not fall within the responsibilities of the Washington State Board Against Discrimination; To report periodically to the Mayor and City Council on such studies and investigations and to make recommendations for appropriate remedial action when indicated, and the Commission may establish and supervise a Municipal Listing Service to assist minority members of the community in finding a home of their choice within their ability to pay. It shall be the further duty of the Commission as its initial function to formulate and recommend to the Mayor and City Council within thirty days of the effective date of this ordinance, a proposed ordinance containing such reasonable and practicable regulations as may be necessary to prevent discrimination based upon race, color, religion or national origin in the sale or rental of real property.

Section 3. That to assist the Commission in the performance of its duties the Mayor is authorized to fill, subject to civil service laws and rules, the following positions hereby created in the Executive Department, except where otherwise indicated at the compensation provided for like positions in said department by the 1963 Salary Ordinance (91600):

and to pay such compensation the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) or so much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated from the Emergency Fund; and for the necessary expenses of said Commission including stationery, informational materials, telephone, etc., the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) or so much thereof as

may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from said Emergency Fund and the City Comptroller is authorized to draw and the City Treasurer to pay the necessary warrants.


Section 4. WHEREAS, the appropriations from the Emergency Fund made in Section 3 hereof are to meet actual necessary expenditures of the City for which no appropriation has been made, due to causes which could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of making the 1963 Budget; Now, Therefore, in accordance with RCW 35.32.130 by reason of the facts above stated and the emergency which is hereby declared to exist, this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the approval or signing of the same by the Mayor or passage over his veto, as provided by the Charter of the City.

PASSED by unanimous vote of the City Council the 15 day of July, 1963, and signed by me in open session in authentication of its passage this 15 day of July, 1963.


