ORDINANCE 93257

AN ORDINANCE relating to employees' sick leave under Ordinance 88522 and amending Section 3 thereof to permit transfers of sick leave credit from employment with the Seattle Public Library.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 3 of Ordinance 88522, entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE relating to and providing a uniform plan for sick leave for city officers and employees in classified civil service and superseding Ordinance No. 86655."

be amended as of September 1, 1963 to read as follows:

"Section 3. Change in position or transfer to another City department included in the sick leave plan shall not result in a loss of sick leave accumulated under this ordinance or as a Seattle Public Library employee. An officer or employee reinstated or re-employed in the same or another department included in this plan after termination of service, except after dismissal for cause, resignation or quitting, shall be credited with all unused sick leave accumulated prior to such termination."

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 3 of Ordinance 85523, entitled:

"AN ORDINANCE relating to and providing a uniform plan for sick leave for city officers and employees in classified civil service and superseding Ordinance No. 85555."

be amended as of September 1, 1964 to read as follows:

"Section 3. Change in position or transfer to another City department included in the sick leave plan shall not result in a loss of sick leave accumulated under this ordinance or as a Seattle Public Library employee. An officer or employee reinstated or reemployed in the same or another department included in this plan after termination of service, except after dismissal for cause, resignation or quitting, shall be credited with all unused sick leave accumulated prior to such termination."

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
