BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That


8th Avenue from James Street to Jefferson Street; Also Portion of the Alley in Block 58, Terry's 1st Addition, as recorded in Volume 1 of Flats, page 49, Records of King County, Washington, being that portion of the alley between 7th Avenue and 8th Avenue, from the south line of James Street to the production west of the south line of Lot 3, said block;

be and the same are hereby vacated, reserving to the City of Seattle the right to reconstruct, maintain and operate any existing overhead or underground utilities in said street and alley until the beneficiaries of said vacation arrange with the owner or owners thereof for their removal.




