AN ORDINANCE providing for fluoridation of the municipal water supply and authorizing construction of necessary facilities, all subject to ratification at a special election to be called for such purpose in accordance with the City Charter.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That a source of fluoridation approved by the Washington State Department of Health be added to the Seattle water supply under the rules and regulations of the State Department of Health, such addition to be administered by the Superintendent of Water under the direction of the Director of Public Health of Seattle.

Section 2. That the City Engineer is authorized and directed to prepare such plans and specifications for and under the direction of the Board of Public Works proceed with such work and the construction of such facilities as may be necessary to accomplish the purpose specified in Section 1 hereof which may be effected by the awarding of a contract or contracts therefor or the same or any part thereof may be effected by day labor in the discretion of said Board.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force after ratification by the electors (voters) at a special election to be called for such purpose in accordance with the provisions of Article IV of the City Charter.

Section 4.... This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
