ORDINANCE 99406

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Park Department; authorizing the development as a temporary park of city property at the former Armory site in the vicinity of the Pike Place Market, transferring temporary jurisdiction over such property to the Department of Parks and Recreation, making a reimbursable appropriation from the Emergency Fund and declaring the emergency therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That as recommended in C.F. 268012 the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation under the direction of the Board of Public Works is authorized to proceed by contract or day labor in the discretion of said board with the development of a temporary park at the former Armory site in the vicinity of the Pike Place Market acquired by the City for general municipal purposes pursuant to Ordinance 96532 and more specifically referred to as the northwest portion of the area bounded by Western Avenue, Lenora Street, Alaskan Way and Stewart Street, as contemplated in said C.F., and for such purpose the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000) or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Emergency Fund, reimbursable by an appropriation and transfer of a like amount hereby made and authorized from HUD beautification reimbursement funds presently deposited in the Guaranty Deposits Fund, and the City Comptroller is authorized to draw and the City Treasurer to pay the necessary warrants and make the necessary transfers.

Section 2. Temporary jurisdiction over the general municipal property which is to be improved as a temporary park as authorized in Section 1 hereof is hereby transferred to the Department of Parks and Recreation for temporary park purposes.

Section 3. WHEREAS, the appropriation herein made is to meet actual necessary expenditures of the City for which no appropriation has been made due to causes which could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of making the 1970 Budget; Now, Therefore, in accordance with Ch. 7, Section 8, Laws of Washington 1967, Regular Session, by reason of the facts above stated and the emergency which is hereby declared to exist, this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon the approval or signing of the same by the Mayor or passage over his veto, as provided by the Charter of the City.

PASSED by three-fourths vote of all the members of the City Council the 2 day of November, 1970, and signed by me in open session in authentication of its passage this 2 day of November, 1970.


