RESOLUTION 23842

A RESOLUTION supporting the establishment of recreational drop-in centers, public restrooms, park benches and bus stop shelters in and adjoining the South Central Business District.

WHEREAS, a need exists for improvement in public facilities and amenities within and around the South Central Business District, including the Pioneer Square and International District areas; and

WHEREAS, Skid Road residents have exhibited a need for indoor recreational centers to function as places as alternatives to street corners; and

WHEREAS, there has not existed a sufficient number of public restrooms in the Pioneer Square area since the closing of public restroom facilities under the Pioneer Square pergola;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Seattle supports the establishment of recreational drop-in centers, public restrooms, park benches and bus stop shelters within and adjoining the South Central Business District, including the Pioneer Square and International District areas; and

FURTHER, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Seattle directs the Department of Community Development and the Seattle Model City Program to investigate the feasibility of reopening the public restroom facilities under the Pioneer Square pergola and report their findings to the Seattle City Council no later than January 1, 1973.


