for a downpayment toward a home for our little family,our children  
where born in Seattle,Robert (27) Patricia (15) .

I am in good standing with my neighbors,but I believe a nice  
neighborhood is beautified by caring and have feeling for the people  
next door.To impose hardship on someone who is not in the position  
to afford this Luxury,especialy in this inflationary time,is selfish  
and wasteful.

I reside at 1100 E. Edgar Street.There are 6 houses on our Street.  
5 Homeowners are against undergrounding,1 is for it.

The person for it ownes 2 houses on Boyer Ave. Both homes are rented



out. The owner has never resided in our neighborhood, and the homes look neglected. (This is not of my concern). I am not criticizing for any other reason but to show that in this case beautifying via undergrounding spells speculation.

RESOLUTION NO. 25133

Be It Resolved by the City Council of the City of Seattle:

(1) That it is the intention of the City Council to order the improvement of BOYER AVENUE EAST from East Roanoke Street to approximately 50 feet north of East Hamlin Street; EAST EDGAR STREET from 11th Avenue East to Boyer Avenue East; and EAST HAMLIN STREET from 11th Avenue East to approximately 160 feet east of Boyer Avenue East;

by constructing underground utilities lines and a residential street lighting system in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 144, Laws of 1957; and Chapter 119, Laws of 1967;

and doing such other work as may be necessary therewith, all in accordance with plans to be prepared by the City Engineer and the Superintendent of Lighting under supervision of the Board of Public Works.

(2) That all persons who may desire to object thereto are hereby notified to appear and present such objections at a meeting of the Utilities Committee of the City Council to be held in the Council Chamber in the Seattle Municipal Building in the City of Seattle at o'clock m., on the day of, 19, which time and place is hereby fixed for hearing all matters relating to said improvement, and all objections thereto, and for determining the method of payment for said improvement.

(3) That the Board of Public Works shall submit to the City Council, at or prior to said date, all data and information required by law to be submitted.

(4) That the cost and expense of said improvement shall be borne by and assessed against the property liable therefor, as provided by law.

**Gentlemen:**

We are returning herewith a petition of property owners for the improvement of **BOYER AVENUE EAST** from East Roanoke Street to approximately 50 feet north of East Hamlin Street and of certain other streets, by constructing underground utilities lines, etc. This petition contains valid and incomplete signatures to the extent of 59.81 percent of the frontage, and 60.97 percent of the area proposed to be assessed for this improvement.

Also attached is a petition of property owners opposing the formation of a local improvement district for the improvement of Boyer Avenue East, et al. This opposition petition contains valid and incomplete signatures to the extent of 25.81 percent of the frontage, and 22.60 percent of the area that would be assessed for the subject improvement.

We respectfully recommend that the attached resolution be authorized and referred for plans and estimates to put forth the improvement of Boyer Avenue East, et al, and bring the proposed local improvement district to a statutory public hearing. The City Light Department is in agreement with this recommendation. We also recommend that the attached petitions and report thereon be attached to the resolution instead of being made into a separate file.

In accordance with the City Council's policy regarding appropriation of funds for local improvement districts at the initiation of the project, we also recommend passage of the attached council bill which appropriates the sum of \$2,000 from the Light Fund to finance the preparation of preliminary estimates, the preliminary assessment roll and maps, and other related

activities required of the Engineering Department prior to the public hearing for the improvement of Boyer Avenue East, et al. If a local improvement district is created for this project, these preconstruction costs will be reimbursed by the L.I.D.

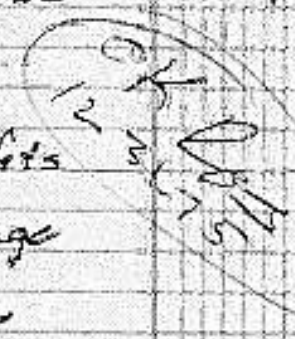

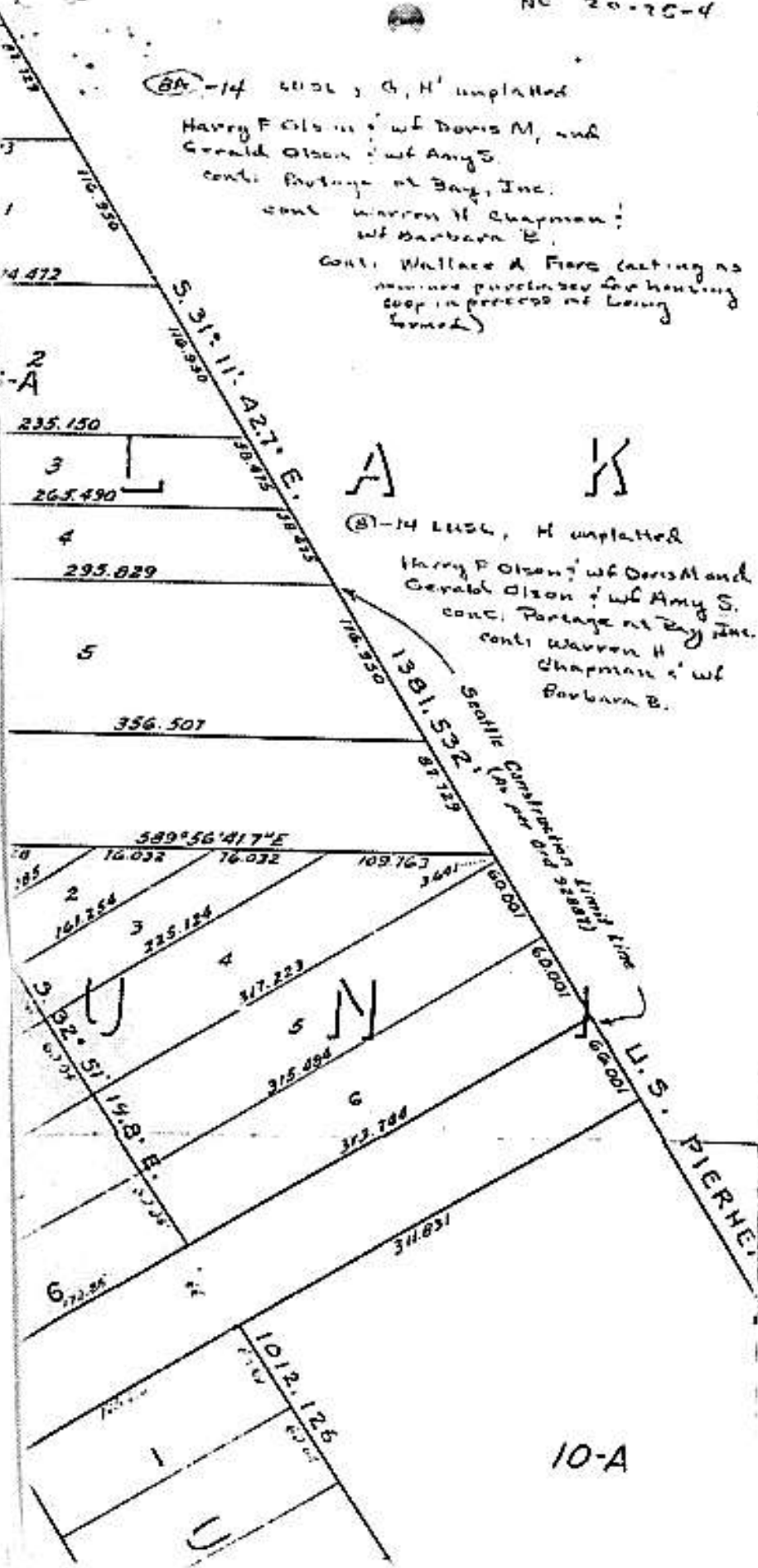

be improved by constructing underground utilities lines and a residential street lighting system in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 144, Laws of 1957; and Chapter 119, Laws of 1967, and by doing such other work as may be necessary therewith, all in accordance with plans to be prepared by the City Engineer and Superintendent of Lighting under supervision of the Board of Public Works; and the payment therefor be made by special assessments payable in ten (10) equal annual installments, under the mode of installment notes.

Assessments for improvement constructed in the public street area will be made on the basis of benefits. For this project, one benefit has been determined to be \$1,335 for work within the public right of way and each property receiving benefit from all items of the improvement shall be presumed to received one benefit. The project will include the conversion to underground of power and telephone facilities and installation of street lighting facilities in the public right of way to serve the district outlined on the attached sketch. In addition, there will be a charge of \$140 for undergrounding CATV facilities in the area. The laws requires that all benefited property be included in an improvement district; therefore, when the final improvement plan is completed, certain properties, not now considered to be benefited, may have to be included within the district for either full or partial benefit.

- EAST HAMLIN STREET from 11th Avenue East to approximately 160 feet east of Boyer Avenue East;

not be improved by constructing underground utilities lines and a residential street lighting system in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 144, Laws of 1957; and Chapter 119, Laws of 1967, or by doing such other work as may be necessary therewith, in accordance with plans to be prepared by the City Engineer and Superintendent of lighting under wupervision of the Board of Public Works; and the payment therefor be made by special assessments payable in ten (10) equal annual installments, under the mode of installment notes.

Further, that no assessments for improvement constructed in the public street area be made.
