The section of Resolution 27577, Proposition 2, following the First BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED is amended as follows:

As contemplated by Charter Article XX, Section 1 providing for charter amendments proposed by the City Council, this resolution shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the City at the next general municipal election. The proposition shall be voted upon in the following manner:

There shall be placed upon the ballot a statement of proposition substantially in the form as follows:

"Referendum No. 1

(Shall the Seattle City Charter, Article IV, Section 6, be amended to authorize the City Council to set regular meeting dates by rule?)

Every qualified voter at the election desiring to ratify the resolution shall mark his/her ballot "Yes". Every voter desiring to reject the resolution shall mark his/her ballot "No."
