competition; and


That Seattle, in the spirit of friendship and peace, also






The official flag shall be of the design depicted in Figure 1. The colors shall be white and teal blue/green (the color of Puget Sound at dusk).


**ASSIGNMENT OF RIGHTS TO FLAG OF
