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RESOLUTION 28380

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A RESOLUTION adopting a scope of work and schedule for achieving compliance with the federal Americans With Disabilities Act [ADA]; and directing the Office of Management and Budget to oversee the work of the Program Coordinator for ADA Compliance and ensure the timely completion of all tasks identified in the scope of work.

WHEREAS, the federal government passed the Americans With Disabilities Act on July 26, 1990; and

WHEREAS, the Americans With Disabilities Act [ADA] becomes effective on January 26, 1992; and

WHEREAS, the City of Seattle, as a government agency, is to comply with the ADA by March 26, 1992; and

WHEREAS, in order to achieve compliance with the ADA, the City must, in a timely manner, conduct a self-evaluation, conduct a review of existing City policies, establish a grievance procedure and public notification procedure, and develop a transition plan and a report on budget implications of required changes; Now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THE MAYOR CONCURRING:

I. ADOPTION OF A SCOPE OF WORK FOR THE TASKS REQUIRED TO COMPLY WITH THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT.

The City Council hereby adopts Attachment 1, "Scope of Work For The City Comprehensive Plan For Complying With The Americans With Disabilities Act," as the official scope of work for the activities needed to comply with the ADA. The column labeled "Due to Council" indicates the date by which each task in the scope of work shall be completed. These dates may be changed only with the approval of the Chair of the City Council Housing, Human Services and Education Committee.

II. RESPONSIBILITY FOR OVERSIGHT OF THE CITY COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TO MAXIMIZE ACCESS FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES.


1 Except where noted in Attachment 1, the Office of  
2 Management and Budget [OMB] shall be responsible for  
3 managing and supervising the completion of the "The City  
4 Comprehensive Plan For Complying With The Americans With  
5 Disabilities Act." This responsibility shall include  
6 oversight of the work of the Disabilities Program  
7 Coordinator in carrying out the tasks identified in the  
8 scope of work.

9 III. LOOKING BEYOND COMPLIANCE WITH THE ADA

10 It is the intent of the City of Seattle to explore  
11 methods of doing business which maximize access for  
12 people with disabilities, which in some cases may exceed  
13 the minimum requirements of the ADA. As part of its  
14 process of self-evaluation and planning, the Program  
15 Coordinator for ADA compliance will examine alternatives  
16 for maximizing access where possible, *assess costs and*  
17 *report to the City Council.* *AK* *NBA*


