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



"Shall the Seattle City Charter be amended to consolidate the City's financial management functions into a Department of Finance by abolishing the elective offices of City Comptroller and City Treasurer and to establish and prescribe the duties of a City Auditor; and Article XIX, Section 1 and 3 and Article VIII, Sections 1, 2, and 3 of said charter be amended and Article VIII, Sections 4 through 9 of said charter be repealed accordingly?"

Every qualified voter at the election desiring to ratify the resolution shall mark his or her ballot "Yes." Every voter desiring to reject the resolution shall mark his or her ballot "No."

Upon approval of this resolution by the City Council and not less than forty-five (45) days before the date of such election, the City Clerk shall certify to the Director of the Department of Records and Elections of King County as supervisor of Elections this proposition in the form of a ballot title conforming to the foregoing statement of the case, and certify therewith a copy of this resolution in full.
