The new nonprofit corporation should be created by amending the articles of incorporation of One Reel to preserve its nonprofit status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and to establish a new governing board of directors composed of approximately one-third current Bumbershoot Festival Commissioners, one-third current One Reel board members, and one-third new community representatives. The Executive shall be responsible for negotiating the terms of this Agreement on behalf of the City. The Agreement shall be subject to City Council approval. It is the City's intention that the proposed Agreement between the City and the nonprofit corporation be submitted to the City Council by December 31, 1994 for final approval.

The new nonprofit corporation should be responsible for 100% of the cash flow 7. obligations and financial risk associated with producing the Bumbershoot Festival and any other events that it chooses to produce. The City will not bear any financial risk for any cost overruns or shortfalls in revenue. The City's financial commitment to Bumbershoot will end December 31, 1998.

- The new nonprofit board will be responsible for setting ticket prices for the 1995 and 8. succeeding Bumbershoot Festivals. At the end of the four year period (ending in 1998) if the cash reserves of the nonprofit corporation exceeds \$200,000 and the ending operating balance is in excess of \$600,000, then any excess operating balance over \$600,000 will be prorated equally between the City of Seattle and the nonprofit corporation

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- 11. City sponsorship of the Bumbershoot Festival shall be based on the following conditions:
 - a. The City and the nonprofit corporation must have negotiated a multi-year Agreement regarding the presentation of annual Bumbershoot Festivals at the Seattle Center that: (1) maintain the essential character and artistic and cultural diversity of such Festival and (2) continue the Festival's tradition as an affordable, public event celebrating regional, national and international arts and entertainment. This Agreement will also detail cash reserve assumptions and revenue projections.
 - b. The Bumbershoot Festival must be budgeted to at least break even in each year, not counting any compensation from the City for City-purchased artistic services and programming.
 - c. The City shall reserve the right to terminate the nonprofit corporation's use of the name "Bumbershoot" and product and promotional licensing rights associated therewith and to reassume management of the festival if the nonprofit corporation is not meeting the terms of the Agreement between the City and the nonprofit corporation.
- 12. The Agreement between the City and the nonprofit corporation shall include the specific details of the conditions for the City's purchase of services and sponsorship of the festival and the specific conditions and circumstances under which the City would reassume management of the Festival, including use of Seattle Center facilities.
- 13. The Seattle Center is authorized and directed to negotiate a use agreement with the nonprofit corporation, similar in terms and conditions to the current Memorandum of Agreement between the Seattle Center and the Bumbershoot Festival Commission, that specifies the conditions for use of Seattle Center grounds and facilities for the

Bumbershoot Festival. The nonprofit corporation's Seattle Center use agreement may be incorporated into the Agreement between the City and the nonprofit corporation referenced in paragraph 6 above. Termination by the City of the nonprofit corporation's rights to use of the name "Bumbershoot" shall terminate the nonprofit corporation's agreement regarding the use of Seattle Center facilities.

14. The nonprofit corporation shall provide to the City, on an annual basis, an independent audit of the revenues and expenditures of the nonprofit corporation.
