	A RESOLUTION expressing the Seattle City Council and Mayor's sympathy and condolences to Sam Smith's family and friends upon his passing and our deep appreciation for his

3	WHEREAS, Sam Smith was born July 21, 1922, in the Louisiana woods, the son of a Baptist preacher, school teacher, and farmer; and

5 6	WHEREAS, the City of Seattle recognizes Sam Smith as a uniquely gifted and deeply principled man who was a Sunday school teacher, successful politician, and a mentor to up-and-coming leaders in minority communities throughout the state; and
7	WHEREAS, in 1967, Sam Smith became the first African-American to be elected to the Seattle City Council where he served with great distinction over a period of 24 years and as Council President for eight years; and
9	WHEREAS, before his service on the City Council, he provided important leadership in the civil rights movement and in 1959 became the second African-American elected to the Washington State Legislature where he served for 10 years; and
11	WHEREAS, in 1967, Sam was honored as the "Legislator of the Year" by the Young Men's Democratic Club and, in 1985, the Municipal League and the Urban League named

15 16	WHEREAS, Sam Smith left all of us with legendary expressions which capture essential principles of City Council operation, such as "it takes five votes to make policy" and dazzled, as well as entertained us, with his ability to cut to the heart of issues; and
