WHEREAS, Ordinance 119527, passed by the Seattle City Council on July 12, 1999, authorized the Chief of Police to enter into an agreement for and on behalf of The City of Seattle for financial assistance from the United States Department of Justice and the United States Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation in the total amount of \$275,000 for the Weed and Seed Program in the East Precinct; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice has advised the Seattle Police Department that a limited amount of additional funding is available to fund program activities in 2000 and beyond; and

WHEREAS, The City of Seattle desires to make application for this additional funding; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE:

The Mayor and/or the Chief of Police is authorized to file an application on behalf of The City of Seattle with the United States Department of Justice and with the United States Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation for financial assistance in the total approximate amount of One Hundred Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000) for the purpose of continuing the Weed and Seed Program in the East Precinct.

The Mayor and/or the Chief of Police is authorized to furnish such additional information as the United States Department of Justice may require in connection with the grant application.

Dear Councilmember Compton:

We request the City Council's approval of the attached resolution. This resolution authorizes the Chief of Police to submit a grant application in the total amount of \$175,000 for continued financial assistance under the Weed and Seed Program to revitalize neighborhoods in the East Precinct.

Since 1993 the City has been receiving grant funds from the Weed and Seed Program through the Department of Justice to revitalize the neighborhoods in Central Seattle. An East Precinct Community Advisory Committee has been formed with membership from community and business associations from the participating neighborhoods, and includes various governmental agency representatives. The Committee assists in the preparation of the grant application, prioritizes coordinated law enforcement efforts, and oversees the distribution of grant funds to the social service and educational agencies within the guidelines of the grant regulations. The renewal application for the Central site is due by April 20, 2000

Legislation Title: A RESOLUTION authorizing the submission of a grant application to the United States Department of Justice Assistance and the United States Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation for financial assistance under the Weed and Seed Program in the total amount of One Hundred Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000) to revitalize neighborhoods in the East Precinct.

Summary of the Legislation: Legislation authorizes the Police Department to submit a grant application for continuation funding for the Weed and Seed Program in East Precinct in the total amount of \$175,000.

Background (Include justification for the legislation and funding history, if applicable): The Weed and Seed Program has been successfully operating in Central Seattle since 1993. The Central Weed & Seed Program coordinates the delivery of criminal justice and social services to eliminate violent crime, drug-trafficking, and drug-related crime and to provide a safe environment for law-abiding citizens. The Department of Justice has advised SPD that a limited amount of continuation funding is available to fund program activities in 2000.

Public/Private Partnership Review Status: This grant is not subject to P4 review.

Is the Legislation Subject to Public Hearing Requirements: A public hearing is required. No public hearings have been held to date concerning this grant renewal application.

Fiscal Sustainability Issues (related to grant awards): Since city staff and the community are still working on the elements of the application, it is not known if there are any sustainability issues that need to be addressed. This question can be answered at the time the Council considers an ordinance accepting the funds.
