WHEREAS, Council Bill 113587, if passed, will authorize the Chief of Police to enter into agreements for and on behalf of The City of Seattle for financial assistance in the 2000 application cycle from the United States Department of Justice and the United States Department of Justice, Federal Bureau of Investigation in the total amount of \$225,000 for the Weed and Seed Program in Central Seattle; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice has advised the Seattle Police Department that a limited amount of additional funding is available to fund program activities in 2001 and beyond; and

WHEREAS, the application deadline for the 2001 application cycle is June 29, 2001; and

WHEREAS, The City of Seattle desires to make application for this additional funding; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE:

The Mayor and/or the Chief of Police is authorized to file an application on behalf of The City of Seattle with the United States Department of Justice, Executive Office for Weed and Seed for financial assistance in the approximate amount of Two Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$225,000) for the purpose of continuing the Weed and Seed Program in Central Seattle.

The Mayor and/or the Chief of Police is authorized to furnish such additional information as the United States Department of Justice may require in connection with the grant application.

**Legislation Title:**

A RESOLUTION authorizing the submission of a grant application to the United States Department of Justice, Executive Office for Weed and Seed for financial assistance under the Weed and Seed Program in the approximate amount of Two Hundred Twenty Five Thousand Dollars (\$225,000) to continue to revitalize neighborhoods in Central Seattle.

**Summary of the Legislation:**

This legislation authorizes the Police Department to submit a grant application for the 2001 application cycle for continuation funding for the Weed and Seed Program in Central Seattle in the amount of \$225,000. Funding will be allocated between the Police Department and the Human Services Department.

**Background (Include justification for the legislation and funding history, if applicable):**

The Weed and Seed Program in Central Seattle has been in effect since 1993. Weed and Seed programs coordinate the delivery of criminal justice and social services to eliminate violent crime, drug-trafficking, and drug-related crime and to provide a safe environment for law-abiding citizens. The grant authorized by this resolution will provide continuation funding from October 1, 2001 through September 30, 2002.

**Public/Private Partnership Review Status:**

This grant is not subject to P4 review.

**Is the Legislation Subject to Public Hearing Requirements:**

There is no public hearing requirement.

**Fiscal Sustainability Issues (related to grant awards):**

There is a sustainability issue surrounding the various human service agencies under contract to HSD. If the grant funds are not renewed in the future, the expectation in the community will be that the City will support the agencies with General Fund.
