RESOLUTION NO. 3035

Whereas, the Pike Place public market was established for the benefit of the sellers of produce and other goods and merchandise as well as for the buyers of the City of Seattle; and

Whereas, American citizens and taxpayers who contribute to its support through the payment of taxes should be given first consideration in the allotment of space at said market; and

Whereas, many American citizens are barred from the benefits of the market through being crowded out by alien gardeners and farmers;

Now Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE:

That the market inspector in charge of the Pike Place market be directed to see that American citizens in the future are given the preference as far as possible when allotting space to gardeners and others selling produce and other goods at said market.
