In 2005, the President and Congress approved a list of Base Realignment and Closure ("BRAC") installations, including the Fort Lawton Army Reserve Center. The City of Seattle requested and was appointed by the United States Department of Defense to be the Local Reuse Authority ("LRA") in July 2006. One requirement of the BRAC process is that there must be an official City action adopting and approving the redevelopment plan included in the Application developed by the LRA in order for the Application to be submitted to the United States Department of Defense and Department of Housing and Urban Development. This legislation serves to meet that requirement.

I am pleased to transmit the attached proposed Resolution that authorizes the Director of the Office of Housing to submit to the United States Departments of Defense and Housing and Urban Development, the Fort Lawton Application that includes a Redevelopment Plan, a homeless assistance submittal, and public comments. The Federal government requires that the Redevelopment Plan be adopted before the City submits its application.

In 2005, the President and Congress approved the closure of the Fort Lawton Army Reserve Center as part of the Base Realignment and Closure Act.
