- Section 6. The Seattle Freight Advisory Board shall be composed of twelve members. Six members will be appointed by the Mayor, and five members will be appointed by the City Council; all eleven appointments are subject to City Council confirmation. These eleven members will serve two-year terms, with the initial term of six members to be three years, and after that, two years. Members whose terms have expired may serve until reconfirmed or replaced. Members may serve no more than two consecutive terms. The twelfth board member will be designated by the Port of Seattle and will not be subject to the two-year term limitation.
- Section 7. Board members should, to the extent possible, live in Seattle and/or represent a business, organization or agency that has a significant presence in Seattle, and have an interest in improving the movement of freight in the City.
  - Section 8. Board members should be, to the extent possible, representative of:
  - Different modes and types of freight;
  - Different geographic areas of the City, including the Duwamish Manufacturing Industrial Center and the Ballard/Interbay Northend Manufacturing Center;
