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3 A RESOLUTION granting conceptual approval to construct, maintain, and operate a below-
4 grade waste-heat conveyance system and utility tunnels under and across Virginia Street,
5 between 5th Avenue and 6th Avenue, and 6th Avenue, between Virginia Street and
6 Lenora Street; and acknowledging the applicants' plans for future expansion in the Denny
Triangle neighborhood; as proposed by Eco District LLC.

7 WHEREAS, Eco District LLC and Acorn Development LLC have both applied for permission to
8 construct a below-grade waste-heat conveyance system and utility tunnels (including
9 facilities for the conveyance of non-potable water and communications) in the Denny
Triangle neighborhood (the "Utility Projects"); and

10 WHEREAS, the portion of the Utility Projects, under and across Virginia Street, between 5th
11 Avenue and 6th Avenue, and 6th Avenue, between Virginia Street and Lenora Street (the
"Eco District Project"), will be owned and operated by Eco District LLC; and

12 WHEREAS, the purpose of the Utility Projects is to operate a waste-heat conveyance system that
13 captures waste-heat energy from the Westin Building Exchange at 2001 6th Avenue and
14 transfers that waste-heat energy to the new Acorn Development LLC (Amazon) campus
15 and neighboring buildings in the Denny Triangle neighborhood to be used as a green
heating and cooling source; and

16 WHEREAS, the waste-heat generated from the Westin Building Exchange is currently exhausted
17 into the atmosphere. The proposed waste-heat conveyance system would consist of water
18 pipes that transfer warm water from the Westin Building Exchange to the Amazon
19 campus; mechanical equipment on the Amazon campus will extract heat from the water
to be used for heating the campus buildings and cooler water will be returned to the
Westin Building Exchange to cool its data center spaces; and

20 WHEREAS, Eco District LLC and Acorn Development LLC have future plans to expand the
21 Utility Projects in the Denny Triangle neighborhood. These anticipated connections
22 would occur in the area bounded by Virginia Street, Westlake Avenue, 8th Avenue, Bell
23 Street, and 3rd Avenue, and would include underground crossings of one or more of
those streets; and

24 WHEREAS, in making a recommendation, the Director of the Seattle Department of
25 Transportation ("Director") considered the plans and application materials submitted by
26 Eco District LLC to construct the Eco District Project and recommends that conceptual
27 approval be granted; NOW, THEREFORE,

1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEATTLE, THE**
2 **MAYOR CONCURRING, THAT:**

3 Section 1. The City Council finds that the below-grade waste-heat conveyance system
4 and utility tunnels that would run under and across Virginia Street, between 5th Avenue and 6th
5 Avenue, and 6th Avenue, between Virginia Street and Lenora Street, (the "Eco District Project")
6 and the desired future expansion of the Utility Projects, as proposed by the Eco District LLC, are
7 in accordance with and in the public interest.
8

9 Section 2. As conditions for obtaining permission to construct the project, Eco District
10 LLC shall:

11 (1) Provide engineering and utility plans for additional review and permitting by the
12 Seattle Department of Transportation ("SDOT"), which the Director will circulate to other City
13 departments and any public and private utilities affected by the installation of the proposed
14 project;

16 (2) Provide (i) a surety bond, (ii) covenant agreement, and (iii) public liability insurance
17 naming the City as an additional insured or self-insurance, as approved by the City's Risk
18 Manager;

19 (3) Pay all City permit fees;

20 (4) Obtain all necessary permits;

21 (5) Maintain and inspect the Eco District Project; and

22 (6) Remove the Eco District Project and restore the right-of-way to its original condition
23 upon expiration of the term permit at the direction of the Director or City Council in accordance
24 with the provisions of the term permit ordinance.
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1 Section 3. After this resolution is adopted, SDOT will present to the Council a draft term
2 permit ordinance identifying the conditions under which permission may be granted for the use
3 of the right of way for the Eco District Project. Permission to use the right of way is subject to
4 the Council's decision to approve, deny, or modify the draft term permit ordinance presented by
5 the Director.

6 Section 4. Eco District LLC and/or Acorn Development LLC have future plans to expand
7 the Utility Projects in the Denny Triangle neighborhood. These anticipated connections would
8 occur in the area bounded by Virginia Street, Westlake Avenue, 8th Avenue, Bell Street, and 3rd
9 Avenue. Any future expansion by either Eco District LLC or Acorn Development LLC will
10 require a new or amended term permit ordinance approved by City Council.

11 Section 5. As recommended by the Director and the Mayor, conceptual approval for
12 construction of the Eco District Project under and across Virginia Street, between 5th Avenue
13 and 6th Avenue, and 6th Avenue, between Virginia Street and Lenora Street, is GRANTED.

A RESOLUTION granting conceptual approval to construct, maintain, and operate a below-grade waste-heat conveyance system and utility tunnels under and across Virginia Street, between 5th Avenue and 6th Avenue, and 6th Avenue, between Virginia Street and Lenora Street; and acknowledging the applicants' plans for future expansion in the Denny Triangle neighborhood; as proposed by Eco District LLC.

Summary of the Legislation:

The proposed resolution grants the conceptual approval for Eco District LLC to construct, maintain, and operate a below-grade waste-heat conveyance system and utility tunnels under and across Virginia Street, between 5th Avenue and 6th Avenue, and 6th Avenue, between Virginia Street and Lenora Street. The purpose of the project is to operate a waste-heat conveyance system that captures waste-heat energy from the Westin Building Exchange at 2001 6th Avenue and transfers that waste-heat energy to the new Acorn Development LLC (Amazon) campus and neighboring buildings in the Denny Triangle neighborhood. A map illustrating the currently proposed connections is on Attachment A.

Background:

Eco District LLC and Acorn Development LLC plan to construct a below-grade waste-heat conveyance system and utility tunnels in the Denny Triangle neighborhood to provide a green heat source to the Amazon campus. The proposed waste-heat conveyance system will consist of water pipes that transfer warm water from the Westin Exchange Building to the Amazon campus. Mechanical equipment on the Amazon campus will extract heat from the water to be used for heating the campus buildings and cooler water will be returned to the Westin Building Exchange to cool its data center spaces.

Eco District LLC and Acorn Development LLC have future plans to expand the waste-heat conveyance system and utility tunnels in the Denny Triangle neighborhood in the area bounded by Virginia Street, Westlake Avenue, 8th Avenue, Bell Street, and 3rd Avenue. Acorn Development LLC has submitted a separate application for their waste-heat conveyance system and utility tunnels. A map showing the boundaries for future connections in the Denny Triangle neighborhood is on Attachment B.



Area Map




Attachment A – Eco District LLC Current Waste-Heat Conveyance System and Utility Tunnels Connection Map


