Motion was made by Councilmember Mosqueda, duly seconded and carried, to amend Council Bill 120391, by amending Section 10, as shown in the strike through and underlined language below:

Section 10. The Cannabis Needs Assessment shall be conducted by an independent academic institution with local expertise in identifying training needs for workers in a variety of industries, developing industry- and job-specific training, and delivering job skills programs ~~entity, such as a Seattle-based educational institution, in partnership with a non-profit organization with experience in curriculum development, administering retail training and apprenticeship programs in the State of Washington, with expertise in the roles and functions of jobs within the cannabis industry,~~ and that is not ~~primarily~~ funded by cannabis businesses or employer associations.

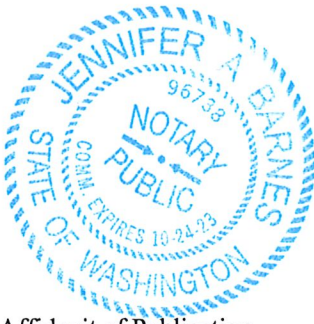
