ORDINANCE 102107

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Design Commission; amending Section 3 of Ordinance 96897 to provide for the addition of a professional fine artist as a member of said Design Commission and to include the Seattle Arts Commission as one of the membership nominating organizations.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That as recommended by the Mayor in C.F. 274942, Section 3 of Ordinance 96897 is amended to read as follows:

Section 3. Subject to the provisions of this ordinance, the Commission shall act in a consulting capacity, advisory to Mayor, City Council, and appropriate City officials in connection with environmental and design aspects of Capital Improvement Projects of the City. The Commission shall consist of eight members appointed by the Mayor, subject to confirmation of a majority of the City Council and may be removed by the Mayor, subject to such confirmation. Membership shall include two licensed architects, one professional urban planner, one landscape architect, two licensed professional engineers, one professional fine artist, and one lay member. The Mayor shall solicit recommendations for membership from the American Institute of Architects, Washington State Council; The American Institute of Planners, Pacific Northwest Chapter; The American Society of Landscape Architects; The Consulting Engineers Council of Washington; The American Society of Civil Engineers; The Seattle Arts Commission; and other professional organizations for the non-lay members. The lay member shall be selected because of particular qualifications in matters related to the purpose of the Commission.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

ORDINANCE 102107

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Seattle Design Commission amending Section 3 of Ordinance 36897 to provide for the addition of a professional fine artist as a member of said Design Commission and to include the Seattle Arts Commission as one of the membership nominating organizations.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That as recommended by the Mayor in C. P. 374942 Section 3 of Ordinance 36897 is amended to read as follows:

Section 2. Subject to the provisions of this ordinance, the Commission shall act in a consulting capacity, advisory to Mayor, City Council, and appropriate City officials in connection with environmental and design aspects of Capital Improvement Projects of the City. The Commission shall consist of EIGHT members appointed by the Mayor, subject to confirmation of a majority of the City Council and may be removed by the Mayor, subject to such confirmation. Membership shall include two licensed architects, one professional urban planner, one landscape architect, two licensed professional engineers, ONE PROFESSIONAL FINE ARTIST, and one lay member. The Mayor shall solicit recommendations for membership from the American Institute of Architects, Washington State Council; The American Institute of Planners, Pacific Northwest Chapter; The American Society of Landscape Architects; The Consulting Engineers Council of Washington; The American Society of Civil Engineers; THE SEATTLE ARTS COMMISSION; and other professional organizations for the non-lay members. The lay member shall be selected because of particular qualifications in matters related to the purpose of the Commission.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
