ORDINANCE 103016

AN ORDINANCE amending Sections 1 and 4 of Ordinance 102459 to impose a tax upon the utilization of punchboards and pull-tabs in accordance with Chapter 218, Laws of Washington, 1973 1st Ex. Sess.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance 102459 as last amended and reenacted by Ordinance 102835 is further amended to read as follows:

Section 1. In accordance with Chapter 218, Laws of Washington, 1973 1st Ex. Sess., there is hereby levied upon all persons, associations and organizations conducting or operating within the City any gambling activity authorized by or under Section 3 of said Chapter 218, Laws of Washington, 1973 1st Ex. Sess., a tax in amounts as follows:

(a) For the utilization of punchboards and pull-tabs, chances on which shall be sold only to adults, and which shall have a twenty-five cent limit on a single chance thereon, a tax in an amount equal to twenty-five hundredths of one percent (0.0025) of the first \$10,000 or part thereof of the gross income each month of the business in which such punchboards and pull-tabs are displayed;

(b) For the conduct of bingo games, raffles and amusement games, a tax in an amount equal to the gross revenue received therefrom multiplied by rates as follows:

Gross Revenue per Occasion	Rate of Tax
\$3001 - up	7%
2001 - 3000	5%
1001 - 2000	4%
201 - 1000	2%
0 - 200	none

provided, that the conduct of such amusement games at the Seattle Center pursuant to a concession agreement with the City shall be exempt from the tax imposed by this ordinance.

Section 2. That Section 4 of Ordinance 102459 as last amended and reenacted by Ordinance 102835 is further amended to read as follows:

Section 4. It shall be the duty of every person, association or organization liable for the payment of any tax imposed by this ordinance to keep and preserve for the period of five years such books and records as will accurately reflect the amount of gross income of the business or gross revenue received from the conduct of bingo games, as the case may be, and from which can be determined the amount of tax for which such person, association or organization may be liable under the provisions of this ordinance; and all such books and records, and also invoices, inventories and stocks of goods, wares and merchandise shall be open for inspection at all reasonable times by the Director of Licenses and Consumer Affairs or his duly authorized agent.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 3..... This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.



ORDINANCE 103016

AN ORDINANCE amending Sections 1 and 4 of Ordinance 102433 to impose a tax upon the utilization of punchboards and pull-tabs in accordance with Chapter 214, Laws of Washington, 1973 1st Ex. Sess.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance 102433 as last amended and reenacted by Ordinance 102535 is further amended to read as follows:

Section 1. In accordance with Chapter 214, Laws of Washington, 1973 1st Ex. Sess., there is hereby levied upon all persons, associations and organizations conducting or operating within the City any GAMBLING ACTIVITY authorized by or under Section 3 of said Chapter 214, Laws of Washington, 1973 1st Ex. Sess., a tax in AMOUNTS AS FOLLOWS:

(A) FOR THE UTILIZATION OF PUNCHBOARDS AND PULL-TABS, CHANCES ON WHICH SHALL BE SOLD ONLY TO ADULTS, AND WHICH SHALL HAVE A TWENTY-FIVE CENT LIMIT ON A SINGLE CHANCE THEREON A TAX IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO TWENTY-FIVE HUNDREDTHS OF ONE PER CENT (0.0025) OF THE FIRST \$10,000 OR PART THEREOF OF THE GROSS INCOME EACH MONTH OF THE BUSINESS IN WHICH SUCH PUNCHBOARDS AND PULL-TABS ARE DISPLAYED.

(B) FOR THE CONDUCT OF BINGO GAMES, RAFFLES AND AMUSEMENT GAMES, a tax in an amount equal to the gross revenue received therefrom multiplied by rates as follows:

GROSS REVENUE	RATE
FEE OF OCCASION	TAX
\$1001-up	7%
2001-3000	5%
1001-2000	4%
201-1000	2%
0-200	none

provided, that the conduct of such amusement games at the Seattle Center pursuant to a concession agreement with the City shall be exempt from the tax imposed by this ordinance.

Section 2. That Section 4 of Ordinance 102433 as last amended and reenacted by Ordinance 102535 is further amended to read as follows:

Section 4. It shall be the duty of every person, association or organization liable for the payment of any tax imposed by this ordinance to keep and preserve for the period of five years such books and records as will accurately reflect the amount of GROSS INCOME OF THE BUSINESS OR gross revenue received from the conduct of bingo games.
