ORDINANCE 108352

AN ORDINANCE amending Section 30 of the Zoning Ordinance (86300) to increase the penalties for violation thereof to the maximums permitted by law.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 30 of the Zoning Ordinance (86300) is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 30. Anyone violating or failing to comply with any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined in a sum of not exceeding (~~three~~) five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisoned in the City jail for a term not exceeding (~~ninety~~) one hundred eighty (~~90~~) 180 days, or may be both so fined and imprisoned and each day that any one shall continue to violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be considered a separate offense.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.


Transmitted herewith is a proposed ordinance amending Section 30 of the Zoning Ordinance (86300) to increase the penalties for violation thereof to the maximums permitted by law. RCW 35.20.030 relating to municipal courts in cities of more than four hundred thousand population provides that for a violation of the criminal provisions of an ordinance, no greater punishment shall be imposed than a fine of Five Hundred Dollars or imprisonment in the city jail not to exceed six months, or both such fine and imprisonment. The Zoning Ordinance now provides for a maximum penalty of \$300 and/or 90 days in jail.

Proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance must be referred to the Director of the Department of Community Development for report and must be considered by the City Planning Commission at a public hearing, as required by Article 27 of the Zoning Ordinance.





ORDINANCE 18632

AN ORDINANCE amending Section 18 of the zoning Ordinance (18200) to increase the penalties for violation thereof to the maximums permitted by law.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Section 18 of the zoning Ordinance (18200) is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 18. Any person violating or failing to comply with any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined in a sum of not exceeding (three) FIVE hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisoned in the City Jail for a term not exceeding (three) ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY (180) days or may be both so fined and imprisoned and each day that any one shall continue to violate or fail to comply with any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be considered a separate offense.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval if approved by the Mayor otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the City Charter.
