- BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

distinctive quality or identity of such neighborhood or the city.

Section 2. The following controls upon alteration of the landmark are hereby imposed:

A Certificate of Approval must be obtained or the time for denying a Certificate of Approval must have expired before the owner may make alterations or significant changes to the entire exterior of the structure; provided that, nothing herein shall prevent any changes in such features where such changes are necessitated by changes in the liturgy, it being understood that the owner is the exclusive authority on liturgy and is the decisive party in determining what architectural changes are appropriate to the liturgy. Any in-kind maintenance and repair for the above-noted features shall be excluded from the above controls.

Section 3. The following incentives are hereby noted as potentially available to the owner although the listing shall not be construed as all inclusive:

As a part of Code Section 24.74.020 - Special Exceptions - of the City Zoning Ordinance certain incentives are available on an application basis, to permit in certain circumstances, uses not otherwise permitted within the zone in which the Landmark is located.



Section 5. The City Clerk is hereby directed to record this ordinance with the King County Director of Records and Elections, deliver two copies to the City Historic Preservation



REPORT ON DESIGNATION

Name of Property: The Seattle First Baptist Church,

1121 Harvard Avenue

Legal Description: AA Denny's, Broadway Addition, Block 136, Lots 2 & 3.

At its meeting held on September 17, 1980 the City of Seattle's Landmarks Preservation Board voted to approve the designation of the Seattle First Baptist Church as a City of Seattle Landmark based upon satisfaction of the following criteria for designation of City Ordinance, #106348:

> SECTION 3.01 (4) IT EMBODIES THE DISTINCTIVE VISIBLE CHARACTERISTICS OF AN ARCHITECTURAL STYLE, OR PERIOD, OR OF A METHOD OF CONSTRUCTION:

The church is designed eclectically in the English Perpendicular Gothic style. It is well and authentically executed, with rich details in terra cotta. Its most striking feature is its handsome corner tower with copper sheathed spire. This tower, with those of St. Joseph's Church on Capitol Hill, Holy Rosary in West Seattle, Blessed Sacrament in the University District, Bethany Presbyterian on Queen Anne Hill, and Trinity Episcopalian Church on First Hill, combined, provide a sextette of our most outstanding church towers in the City. Although the Gothic style is a bit foreign to the nature of Protestant churches such as First Baptist, nonetheless the internal Protestant, auditorium, form is well expressed in the exterior of this church.

> SECTION 3.01 (6) BECAUSE OF ITS PROMINENCE OF SPATIAL LOCATION, CONTRASTS OF SITING, AGE OR SCALE, IT IS AN EASILY IDENTIFIABLE VISUAL FEATURE OF ITS NEIGHBORHOOD OR THE CITY AND CONTRIBUTES TO THE DISTINCTIVE QUALITY OR IDENTITY OF SUCH NEIGHBORHOOD OR THE CITY:


Since its erection, this church and especially its prominent tower have been attractive, dominant and highly visible element on the skyline of First Hill, and indeed, of the backdrop of the Downtown.

Features identified for preservation include the entire exterior of the church.

PROPOSED LANDMARK CONTROLS AND INCENTIVES FOR RECOMMENDATION TO THE CITY COUNCIL

Seattle First Baptist Church, 1121 Harvard Avenue

To assure the preservation of the specified features and characteristics of the above named Seattle Landmark, a Certificate of Approval issued by the City of Seattle's Landmarks Preservation Board pursuant to City Ordinance #106348, must be obtained, or the time for denying a Certificate of Approval application must have expired, before the owner may make major alterations or significant changes:

- 1. where such changes would affect the exterior of the structure;
- 2. provided that nothing herein shall prevent any changes in such features where such changes are necessitated by changes in the liturgy, it being understood that the church is the exclusive authority on liturgy and is the decisive party in determining what architectural changes are appropriate to the liturgy;
- provided that all in-kind maintenance and repair of the abovenoted features shall be excluded from the Certificate of Approval requirement.

Certain incentives to all Seattle Landmarks are provided under Section 28.2 - SPECIAL EXCEPTIONS - of the City Zoning Code and are noted as potentially available to the owners, on an application basis.
