ORDINANCE **111017**

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Street Use Ordinance, amending SMC Section 15.40.010 and repealing SMC Section 15.40.020, to eliminate the distinction of hours of darkness and daylight and to bring SMC Section 15.40.010 into conformance with SMC Section 11.12.120.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 15.40.010 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Ordinance 90047, as last amended by Ordinance 103891) is amended to read as follows:

15.40.010 Lights and barricades required.
Posting on obstructions in streets.

It shall be unlawful for anyone, in any manner to obstruct, excavate or tear up any public place, without ((~~at all times during the hours of darkness maintaining at the point of obstruction or excavation a barricade and four or more red or flashing amber lights of sufficient power and brilliancy and so placed as to be plainly visible for a distance of not less than five hundred feet in all directions from the point of obstructions. Obstructions in public places during daylight hours shall have sufficient barricades posted in such a manner as to indicate plainly the danger involved.~~ Barricades may)) providing safe and adequate guidance to pedestrian and vehicle traffic moving past the site. Such guidance shall consist of signs, barricades and warning lights. The design and location of such devices shall conform to the City's Traffic Control Manual for In-Street Work. These devices shall be removed at the completion of work or the removal of obstructions in public places providing the surface of the roadway has been restored to the satisfaction of the ((City Engineer)) Director of Engineering.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 2. Seattle Municipal Code Section 15.40.020, Posting on obstructions in arterial streets, is hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.



REQUEST. We request adoption by the City Council of the attached ordinance amending the Seattle Municipal Code.

PURPOSE OF REQUEST. To amend Section 15.40.010 (Lights and barricades required), eliminating the distinction of hours of darkness and daylight. Provision for safe guidance to pedestrians and motorists in excavation areas 24 hours per day is included in this revision. Also, to repeal Section 15.40.020 (Posting on Obstructions in Arterial Streets).

IMPORTANCE. These changes in the Municipal Code bring Section 15.40.010 of the Street Use Ordinance into agreement with Section 11.12.120 of the Traffic Code.
