ORDINANCE 112504

AN ORDINANCE establishing a Zoo Parent Account in the General Donations and Gift Trust Fund, providing for deposits to and expenditures from the account, accepting a donation from the Seattle Zoological Society, and making an appropriation from the account for improvements to the Orangutan Exhibit and the Tapir Pool.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. A Zoo Parent Account is hereby established in the General Donations and Gift Trust Fund. There shall be deposited in the Zoo Parent Account all donations received from the "Zoo Parent Program", under which a member of the public may "adopt" an animal and make contributions as a "foster parent" for its benefit and receive a public acknowledgement for his or her support of the Woodland Park Zoo; and any other donations designated for that account. Disbursements shall be made from the Zoo Parent Account only for purposes of the Zoo Parent Program, and as authorized by the donor, for the development or improvement of exhibit areas or living quarters for zoo animals.

Section 2. The Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, or at his or her request, the Zoo Director is authorized to accept donations from Zoo Parents and others for and deposit the funds in the Zoo Parent Account. Donations to, and expenditures of donations from, the Zoo Parent Account are exempt from the provisions of Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 20.32 (Ordinance 102210, as amended) unless the donor indicates otherwise. Whenever a donor designates a particular object or purpose for which his or her donation shall be used, all the necessary appropriations are hereby made and authorized to

1 expend the donation as designated. The City Comptroller is
2 authorized to draw and the City Treasurer to pay warrants
3 drawn on the account upon vouchers approved by the
4 Superintendent of Parks and Recreation.

5 Section 3. The Zoo Director is authorized to accept a
6 donation of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000) from the Seattle
7 Zoological Society on behalf of the Zoo Parent Program for use
8 in raising the roof, providing climbing structures and making
9 other adjustments in the Great Ape House for orangutans, and
10 for providing a wading pool for tapirs at the llama yard, and
11 other related work. Upon receipt, the donation shall be
12 deposited in the General Donations and Gift Trust Fund, Zoo
13 Parent Account. The donation, when received together with
14 accrued interest, if any, is hereby appropriated from such
15 Fund and Account for making improvements in the Great Ape
16 House for the orangutans and for providing the Tapir's wading
17 pool. The City Comptroller is authorized to draw and the City
18 Treasurer to pay the necessary warrants.

19 Section 4. Establishment of the Zoo Parent Account, the
20 acceptance of the donation, and the preparation of designs and
21 plans, each pursuant to the authority and prior to the effec-
22 tive date of this ordinance, are hereby ratified and
23 confirmed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
