11 Section 1. As of January 1, 1989, Section 21.28.370 of the
12 Seattle Municipal Code (Section 4 of Ordinance 111425, as last
13 amended by Ordinance 113730) is further amended as follows:

15 Section 21.28.370. Sewer Customer Charge.

17 There is hereby imposed upon all premises served by the sewerage
18 utility and on which water is consumed, a City sewer (~~customer charge~~
19 of) (~~((One Dollar and Ten Cents (\$1.10)))~~) volume rate shall be (~~((One~~
20 ~~Dollar and Eighty eight cents (\$1.88)))~~) (Two Dollars and Nine Cents
21 (\$2.09)) per one hundred (100) cubic feet of metered flow per month.

23 Section 2. As of January 1, 1989, Section 21.76.040 of the
24 Seattle Municipal Code (Section 4 of Ordinance 104472, as last amended

27 Section 21.76.040 Rate of credit.

Persons qualified by the Department of Human Resources as eligible
recipients of elderly/handicapped/disabled utility credits provided
for in Section 21.76.010 shall be granted elderly/handicapped/disabled
billing credits in the following stated monthly, or monthly equivalent
amounts; provided, however, that in no case shall the amount of the
elderly/handicapped/disabled billing credit granted for a utility ser-
vice exceed the amount owing for that service. The 1986 solid waste
credits become effective June 1, 1987.

duplex and multiple-family rates (~~\$2.34~~) (\$3.14)

B. Water:


Those residing in dwellings subject to
single-family and duplex rates \$ 2.30
Those residing in dwellings subject to
multi-family rates \$ 1.00

C. Solid Waste:

Those residing in dwellings subject to
single-family rates \$10.40
Those residing in dwellings subject to
multi-family variable can rates based on
the number of dwelling units, once-per-
week service \$ 6.40
Those residing in dwelling units subject
to multi-family variable can rates based
on the number of dwelling units, two-
times-per-week service \$12.80
Those residing in dwellings subject to
multi-family rates based on the unumber
of detachable containers \$ 2.85
Those residing in dwellings subject to
single or multi-family variable can rates,
once-per-week service, for each unit of
service in excess of one \$ 0.85
Those residing in dwellings subject
to multi-family variable can rates based
on the number of dwelling units, for each
unit of service in excess of one, two-
times-per-week service \$ 1.70

Section 3. Any act consistant with the authority and prior to the
effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.

ORDINANCE 113124

AN ORDINANCE relating to Drainage and Wastewater Utility, adjusting rates for sewer charges and utility credits and amending Section 21.28.370 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Section 4 of Ordinance 111475), as of January 1, 1989, and amending Section 21.76.040 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Section 4 of Ordinance 104472).

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As of January 1, 1989, Section 21.28.370 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Section 4 of Ordinance 111475, as last amended by Ordinance 113723) is further amended as follows:

Section 21.28.370 Sewer Customer Charge.

There is hereby imposed upon all premises served by the sewerage utility and on which water is consumed, a City sewer (customer charge of) **One Dollar and Ten Cents (\$1.10)**; volume rate shall be **(One Dollar and Eighty-eight cents (\$1.88)) (TW) DOLLARS AND NINE CENTS (\$2.09)** per one hundred (100) cubic feet of metered flow per month.

Section 2. As of January 1, 1989, Section 21.76.040 of the Seattle Municipal Code (Section 4 of Ordinance 104472, as last amended by Ordinance 113722) is further amended as follows:

Section 21.76.040 Rate of Credit.

Persons qualified by the Department of Human Resources as eligible recipients of elderly/handicapped/disabled utility credits provided for in Section 21.76.040 shall be granted elderly/handicapped/disabled billing credits in the following stated monthly, or monthly equivalent amounts, provided, however, that in no case shall the amount of the elderly/handicapped/disabled billing credit granted for a utility service exceed the amount owing for that service. The 1986 solid waste credits become effective June 1, 1987.

A. Sewer

Those residing in dwellings subject to single family rates -- **(\$1.00) -- (\$5.23)**

Those residing in dwellings subject to duplex and multiple-family rates -- **(\$2.44) -- (\$3.14)**

B. Water

Those residing in dwellings subject to single-family and duplex rates -- **\$2.30**

Those residing in dwellings subject to multi-family rates -- **\$1.00**

C. Solid Waste

Those residing in dwellings subject to single-family rates -- **\$10.40**

Those residing in dwellings subject to multi-family variable can rates based on the number of dwelling units, once-per-week service -- **\$6.40**

Those residing in dwelling units subject to multi-family variable can rates based on the number of dwelling units, two-times-per-week service -- **\$12.80**

Those residing in dwellings subject to multi-family rates based on the number of detachable containers -- **\$2.85**

Those residing in dwellings subject to single or multi-family variable can rates, once-per-week service, for each unit of service in excess of one -- **\$0.85**

Those residing in dwellings subject to multi-family variable can rates based on the number of dwelling units, for each unit of service in excess of one, two-times-per-week service -- **\$1.70**

Section 3. Any act inconsistent with the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.
