ORDINANCE 114246

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Building and Construction Code, amending Ordinance 110893, as last amended by Ordinance 113734, prescribing fees for Fire Department permits for hazardous materials and processes.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. As of January 1, 1989, Section 2, Seattle Municipal Code Chapter 22.602.040 is amended to read as follows:


