ORDINANCE 114826

AN ORDINANCE relating to the Executive Department; reauthorizing the Office for Strategic Human Services Planning therein; and amending Subchapter VIII to Chapter 3.14 of the Seattle Municipal Code.

WHEREAS, in May, 1986, the Mayor submitted his recommendations on planning reorganization to the City Council and called for the establishment of a long-range planning office to address issues relating to land use and transportation, human services, and the environment; and

WHEREAS, following a series of public forums on the proposed planning reorganization, the City's Planning Commission indicated its general support for the concept of establishing a long-range planning office as proposed by the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, the City Council's Urban Redevelopment Committee has held a number of working sessions to review the Mayor's proposal and on October 15, 1986, held a public hearing on the Committee's preliminary recommendations; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 27526 approved the concept of establishing a human service strategic planning office; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 11319 established the Office of Strategic Human Services Planning for a period of three (3) years and directed the Mayor and Council to assess the need for continuation of the office at the end of that period; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have assessed the need for the continuation of the office and recommends its continuation; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Effective January 1, 1990, SMC 3.14.2010--
3.14.2060 are amended and renumbered as follows:

~~((Section 3.14.2010 Office authorized for three-year period.~~

~~The Office for Strategic Human Services Planning is authorized for a period of three (3) years. At the end of this three (3) year period of time the Council and Mayor shall assess the need for the continuation of the office.))~~

1 Section (~~3.14.2020~~) 3.14.2010 Director--Appointment.

2 The Director of the Office for Strategic Human Services
3 Planning shall be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by a
4 majority of the City Council. As of January 1, 1987, pending
5 permanent appointment, the Mayor is authorized to appoint a
6 person to act as the Director, consistent with Chapter 3.92 of
7 this Code. The Mayor at any time may remove the Director of
8 the Office for Strategic Human Services Planning upon filing a
9 statement of reasons therefor with the City Council.

10 Section (~~3.14.2030~~) 3.14.2020 Director--Duties.

11 Under the supervision of the Mayor, the Director for the
12 Office for Strategic Human Services Planning shall manage the
13 Office for Strategic Human Services Planning, appoint, assign
14 and dismiss all employees in conformance with the City's
15 personnel rules and ordinances, and perform the following
16 functions:

Section 2..... This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

Dear President Smith:

I am pleased to submit the enclosed legislation reauthorizing the Human Services Strategic Planning Office. The Council established HSSPO in 1987 for three years, and requested an assessment at the end of that period to determine the merits of continuing the office. It is clear from the Executive's assessment that the experience of the past three years and the outlook for the future in the human services arena provide a strong basis for recommending the reauthorization of the office.

The effectiveness of the City in carrying out its human services roles has been enhanced by the planning and policy development of this office. City human service improvements in which HSSPO has played an instrumental role over the past three years include:

- o The establishment of appropriate policy frameworks to guide the City's role in responding to children, youth, and family needs, homelessness, and the siting and development of special needs housing and human services.
- o Improved interdepartmental coordination and planning collaboration.
- o Expanded interaction and communication between City staff and State, County, and community-based organizations on human services issues.
- o Better focused strategic plans and program development efforts and better information upon which to base funding and non-funding decisions by the Mayor's Office and City Council.
- o Increased emphasis on accountability and evaluation of program effectiveness.

The current human services outlook suggests a continuing need for strong planning capability within City government.

The City's human services role, including both funding and non-funding efforts, has expanded substantially over the past several years and is likely to continue. In addition to increased City responsibility for human services, changes in demographic and economic trends and patterns of need, service system reorganizations, shifting roles of other human services actors, and the push to develop rational regional approaches for meeting human services needs all dictate increased attention to planning and evaluation on the part of the City.

I believe that the separation of physical planning from human services planning has helped to ensure that appropriate attention and expertise are directed to priority issues in both the human services and physical planning arenas. Experience with the operation of HSSPO over the past three years has also demonstrated that maintaining a core strategic planning capability within the Executive Department is an effective way to stimulate comprehensive planning and increase interdepartmental coordination.

In reauthorizing the office, I am recommending that the annual work program for HSSPO continue to be established by joint resolution of the Council and the Mayor. This process ensures that the office focuses its efforts on projects of priority to both the Mayor and Council. I also recommend that the mission of the office be slightly modified to more accurately reflect its role. Both of these recommendations are reflected in the enclosed legislation.

WHEREAS, in May, 1986, the Mayor submitted his recommendations on planning reorganization to the City Council and called for the establishment of a long-range planning office to address issues relating to land use and transportation, human services, and the environment; and

A. Conduct research necessary to assess human service needs and identify appropriate policy and service delivery responses;

C. Act as liaison with ((state)) public institutions and

organizations in the human services areas to promote appropriate support to human services at the federal, state and local levels. Section ((3.14.2050)) 3.14.2040 Rules and regulations establishment authority.

Pursuant to the Administrative Code (Ordinance 102228, SMC Chapter 3.52), the Director of the Office for Strategic Human Services Planning may establish such rules, procedures and regulations consistent with this subchapter and other ordinances as may be necessary and proper.

Section ((3.14.2060)) 3.14.2050 Annual work programs.

An annual work program shall be set by joint resolution of the Mayor and City Council.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.
