

ORDINANCE 114947

AN ORDINANCE establishing a Discovery Park Memorial Account in the General Donations and Gift Trust Fund, declaring its purposes, and authorizing acceptance of donations thereto.

WHEREAS, the Honorable Donald Voorhees, United States District Judge for the Western District of Washington, Northern Division, passed away on Friday, July 7, 1989. Judge Voorhees was an eminent, highly-respected jurist and greatly admired as a person. Before his appointment to the bench, from 1969-1974, Judge Voorhees served on the Park Board and from 1971 to 1974, he served as chairman of the citizens advisory committee that developed the 1972 Master Plan for Discovery Park and the 1974 Revision. His early work led to conveyance of the site to the City for park purposes and he suggested the name Discovery Park and articulated the vision for the park as an "open space of quiet tranquility for the citizens of this city--a sanctuary where they might escape the turmoil of the City and enjoy the rejuvenation which quiet and solitude and an intimate contact with nature can bring." He participated actively in the Friends of Discovery Park giving the City advice and guidance and assisting in acquiring acreage for expanding the park; the family and friends of Judge Voorhees have requested that donations in his memory be sent to the City for deposit in a memorial account for use in providing visitor facilities and exhibits that further the park's purpose as an urban refuge; Now, Therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. There is hereby established in the General Donations and Gift Trust Fund an account, entitled the Discovery Park Memorial Account, for providing permanent visitors' facilities and exhibits that furthers the park's purpose as an urban refuge. The Superintendent of Parks and Recreation is authorized to accept for and on behalf of The City of Seattle gifts in memory of the late Judge Donald Voorhees and other donations for the account or account purposes and to deposit them in the account. Expenditures from the account shall be on authorizations approved by the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation. The Superintendent

shall consult with Friends of Discovery Park and with the family of Judge Voorhees before expenditures are authorized from the account of donations received before December 31, 1992.

Section 2. Acceptance of donations pursuant to the authority and prior to the effective date of this ordinance is hereby ratified and confirmed.

(To be used for all Ordinances except Emergency.)

Section 3... This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

LEGISLATIVE REQUEST SUPPORTING INFORMATION

In conformance with The City of Seattle's Operating Procedure 200-001 the following information is submitted.

TITLE OF PROJECT

An ordinance establishing a Discovery Park Memorial Account in the General Donations and Gift Trust Fund, declaring its purposes, and authorizing acceptance of donations thereto.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVES

This ordinance will authorize The Department to accept donations in memory of Judge Donald Voorhees, and others to be used for the construction of some type of permanent visitor facilities at Discovery Park.

CURRENT STATUS

As of November 15, 1989, \$10,770 has been donated by 99 contributors. All donations have, to date, been deposited into the Treasurer's Clearing Fund.

HISTORICAL OVERVIEW

Judge Voorhees was actively involved with the development of this acreage as a city park. Additionally:

- He served on the Park Board from 1971 to 1974,
- He chaired the Citizens Advisory Committee which developed the original master plan for Discovery Park and the 1974 revision,
- His work led to the conveyance of the site to the City for Park purposes,
- He suggested the name Discovery Park, and
- He actively participated in the Friends of Discovery Park citizens group.

Judge Voorhees passed away on July 7, 1989. Because of his long standing affiliation with the Parks Department and Discovery Park, family, and friends requested that memorial contributions be sent to the Discovery Park Memorial Fund via the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation.

PERSONNEL REQUIREMENTS

No additional department staff are required to account for these funds.

FACILITY AND EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

The actual type of permanent visitor facility or required equipment is unknown at this time.
