

7 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

8 Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code Section 2.04.430  
9 (Ordinance 112005, section 2) is amended as follows:


10 Section 2.04.430 Expenditure limitations.

11 A. A candidate who signs a campaign contract in  
12 accordance with Section 2.04.410, shall not, during the  
13 campaign year, make expenditures exceeding the aggregate  
14 amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) for  
15 the office of Mayor or (~~Seventy-five-Thousand-Dollars~~  
16 ~~(\$75,000.00)~~) One Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$110,000) for  
17 the (~~officers~~) offices of (~~the~~) City Councilmember, City  
18 Attorney, City Comptroller, and City Treasurer. Provided,  
19 that no more than seventy-five percent (75%) of the applicable  
20 expenditure limitation shall be expended through the day of  
21 the primary election.


22 B. Independent expenditures, as defined in this  
23 chapter, shall not be included in the computation of a  
24 candidate's expenditures.

25 Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in  
26 force thirty (30) days from and after its passage and  
27 approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take  
28 effect at the time it shall become law under the provisions of  
the City Charter.





## ORDINANCE 115917

AN ORDINANCE increasing the expenditure limit for the offices of member of the City Council, City Attorney, City Comptroller and City Treasurer; and amending Seattle Municipal Code Section 2.04.430 (Ordinance 112005, section 2), in connection therewith.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Seattle Municipal Code Section 2.04.430 (Ordinance 112005, section 2) is amended as follows:

Section 2.04.430 Expenditure limitations.

A. A candidate who signs a campaign contract in accordance with Section 2.04.410, shall not, during the campaign year, make expenditures exceeding the aggregate amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) for the office of Mayor or ~~((Seventy-five-Thousand-Dollars +\$75,000.00))~~ One Hundred Ten Thousand Dollars (\$110,000) for the ~~((officers))~~ offices of ~~((the))~~ the City Councilmember, City Attorney, City Comptroller, and City Treasurer. Provided, that no more than seventy-five percent (75%) of the applicable expenditure limitation shall be expended through the day of the primary election.

B. Independent expenditures, as defined in this chapter, shall not be included in the computation of a candidate's expenditures.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become law under the provisions of the City Charter.


