ORDINANCE

115600

AN ORDINANCE amending Seattle Municipal Code Section 4.36.220A. to make members of the City Employees Retirement System, who are 65 years of age or over, eligible for disability retirement.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS

Section 1. Subsection A of Seattle Municipal Code Section 4.36.220 (Ordinance 78444, Section 15 as last amended by Ordinance 101274 Section 1) is further amended as follows:

A. Any member (~~((who has not attained the age of sixty-five-(65)))~~) may be retired for permanent and total disability, either ordinary or accidental, occurring while in City service and not connected with any illness or disability existing prior to entering City service, upon examination as hereinafter set forth, if such employee meets either of the following requirements:

1. The disability of such member arose out of and in the course of his employment as an employee of the City; or

2. Such member had, at the time of occurrence of such disability, at least ten (10) years of City service, over a period of not to exceed fifteen (15) years immediately preceding retirement, provided that City service lost while on previous disability retirement shall not be considered in determining if the applicant has City service in the limits specified.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty days from and after its passage and approval, if approved by the Mayor; otherwise it shall take effect at the time it shall become a law under the provisions of the city charter.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF SEATTLE AS FOLLOWS

A. 1. The disability of such member arose out of and in the course of his employment as an employee of the City; or
2. Such member had, at the time of occurrence of such disability, at least ten (10) years of City service, over a period of not to exceed fifteen (15) years immediately preceding retirement, provided that City service lost while on previous disability retirement shall not be considered in determining if the applicant has City service in the limits specified.
